A Letter from your Holy Family Priest | All Saints' Day

"Here rests in honored glory an American soldier known but to God." These are the words on the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier at Arlington National Cemetery. The Tomb of the Unknown Soldier guards the remains of three unknown American soldiers from World War I, World War II, and the Korean War. It reminds us as Americans of the many who have given their lives for our country while remaining unknown to history.

Today we celebrate All Saints' Day, where we remember the many canonized saints of the Church, but also the countless saints "known but to God." Today is, in a sense, our memorial to the "unknown saint," the faithful Christians through the years who have lived lives of faith, hope, and charity, but who now remain unknown to history.

This day thus reminds us that sainthood is often something quiet, worked out in homes and jobs and schools. Extraordinary generosity, extraordinary patience, extraordinary honesty, and courage – that is the stuff of which saints are made. Today, as we honor all the canonized saints, I hope that each of you has a favorite saint or two, a "spiritual best friend" to whom you can turn when you need guidance or strength. Some of mine are St. John the Baptist, St. Joseph, and St. Teresa of Avila. And today we celebrate in particular with our brothers from the Knights of Columbus, whose founder, Fr. Michael J. McGivney, became this weekend Blessed Michael J. McGivney.

Additionally, though, as we also honor all the unknown saints, we remember our own calling to sanctity. Christ demands of us nothing less than supernatural faith, hope, and love, and (as we hear in today's Gospel) a service to others that honors his presence in the hungry, thirsty, imprisoned, and excluded. May this parish be a community which pushes one another to this level of sanctity. May the saints, our brothers and sisters who have reached this level of sanctity, intercede for us on the way.
