## *A Letter from your Holy Family Priest | "Reaching out and touching hearts"*

Our Gospel reading today captures yet another intimate encounter with Jesus and someone who is sick. The illness featured in this Gospel is not just your average cold. It is Leprosy. And, a diagnosis of this type not only destined you to a life of great suffering physically, but you would also suffer exile from the community.

In a world filled with face masks and hand sanitizer, the actions of Jesus in the Gospel today would be unthinkable. To reach out to someone who is considered by all to be unclean and highly contagious is an unpopular and unwise decision in the time of our Lord, and would be considered the same today. Appearing to not be concerned about this horrible contagion, Jesus drew near to this suffering man and stretched out his hand and touched him. Jesus broke down the social constraints that would have prevented him from drawing near to this man.

Every day, healthcare professionals, volunteers, chaplains, Eucharistic ministers, priests, religious and others reach out to those who are sick and in need of compassionate care. In this time of pandemic, countless people are mirroring Jesus by reaching out and touching the hearts and lives of the most vulnerable. It is in the presence of others, especially the suffering, where we feel the great love that God has for us, a burning love which consumes and purifies our hearts.
