A Letter from your Holy Family Priest | Making achievable spiritual goals

Specific, concrete, achievable. These are the characteristics of a good goal. A goal must be specific – limited in scope, distinct, and recognizable. A goal must be concrete – connected to real life experience. And a goal must be achievable – within one's realistic capacity to attain.

As we continue in the season of Lent, I want to offer you a framework for making specific, concrete, and achievable spiritual goals. This is a framework that Christians over the years have developed to identify the "roots" of sin – the sinful attitudes of thought and desire that give rise to sinful actions. From St. John Cassian, to Pope Gregory the Great, to St. Thomas Aquinas, this list has come down to us as a helpful guide for carrying out our campaign against slavery to sin, and today you can find helpful commentaries from Fr. Robert Spitzer and Bishop Barron. Here they are, the Seven Deadly Sins:

- I. Gluttony: Excessive attachment to physical pleasure and satisfaction through eating, drinking, media use, etc.
- II. Greed: Excessive attachment to wealth and material possessions
- III. Lust: Excessive attachment to sexual satisfaction and the romantic love of others
- IV. Sloth: Sorrow at the need to exert oneself in pursuit of goodness, truth and love
- V. Wrath: An excessive desire for revenge
- VI. Envy: Sorrow at the goodness or joy of others
- VII. Vanity: An excessive desire to be loved, admired, and praised by others

I'm still accepting suggestions for a good acronym for these (GVGLEWS doesn't really do it).

Nevertheless, look over this list and take some time of prayer and reflection to identify which of these "roots of sin" is most present in your soul. Identify some particular times recently when you committed sins because of that particular deadly sin. Finally, go to confession, pray, and go to Mass – through these practices, God's grace, which has the power to change our attitudes of heart and mind, will be actively present in your soul. Then you will be ready to make goals which are specific, concrete and achievable – specified by one of the seven deadly sins, with concrete connections to your daily thoughts and desires, and achievable through God's grace. With these tools, you will be ready to uproot the attitudes which destroy your peace and lead you into sin, and this Lent can be a time of real progress in the spiritual life.
