A letter from your Holy Family Priest | "Jesus Was Amazed at their Lack of Faith"

One of the things that faith has is the capacity to be amazed in our lives for the many things that God has done and does in our history. Jesus always surprises our lives when we don't lose the capacity to admire him in our ordinary moments. He is arriving constantly in many ways in our life.

When those big speakers visit parishes, they come to help us to understand God in our lives, but we don't want to forget that the comprehension of God starts among people we know every day. For the contemporary people of Jesus, the Messiah was expected as somebody spectacular but to recognize the Messiah in someone that they saw grows up, someone of whom they know his family, his origins, someone well known, was difficult. It was a big frustration. It was unacceptable for them. They took offense at him, they weren't amazed, and Jesus was amazed at their lack of faith.

I think this is the point to reflect on this Sunday. We don't want to lose the capacity to be amazed by Jesus. We need to find him without spectacular or extraordinary things. Jesus already said that everything we do to the little ones of this world, we do to him. We need to be amazed at Jesus even at those that are despicable to this world. The saints were people that lived their lives in ordinary things. They give us an example to live in this way. Let's look at Mother Theresa of Calcutta. She didn't expect Jesus in spectacular manifestation. She found him in the despicable.

Jesus is constantly manifested in our life. Jesus is talking to us in the people we meet every day. We don't want Jesus to be amazed at our lack of faith.


