## A letter from your Holy Family priest | "Whatever is received, is received according to the mode of the receiver."

For me, the toughest question about the Blessed Sacrament is this: if this is really Christ's Body and Blood, why don't all of those who receive it become instant saints? We are coming face-to-face with Christ's divine presence hidden in this Host – why haven't we become totally on fire with the power and the love of the Holy Spirit?

It's a tough question, but one which I want to answer today.

Thomas Aquinas and other theologians of the Middle Ages had a saying: "Whatever is received, is received according to the mode of the receiver." This is a philosophical principle which makes a lot of sense – a 500 mL cup can't receive more than 500 mL of water; someone who doesn't speak English can't receive the meaning of English words; if you put a seed in good soil it grows, but if you put it on blacktop it dies.

So it is with the Eucharist. The Eucharist is like a seed – a seed contains the new life of a tomato, cucumber, or corn; analogously, the Eucharist contains the new life of Christ. A seed doesn't really look like the plant it is meant to become, but it still contains within itself all the DNA of that new life. The Eucharist doesn't look like Jesus Christ, but it is nevertheless (as Jesus says in today's Gospel) the Body of Christ, the presence of Jesus, the "DNA" of Jesus Christ.

And still, we know that if a seed lands on bad soil, it will not grow. If our souls are more like blacktop than Wisconsin topsoil, the life of Christ won't grow in us. If our hearts are hardened, if we are in the mode of rejecting Christ or of indifference to God, then the Eucharist cannot grow in us. Whatever is received will be received according to the mode of the receiver.

The truth is that all of us are somewhere between souls of blacktop and souls of good soil. So today, we can ask: how can I make my soul to be better soil to receive the Body of Christ?

A couple simple suggestions – bring a concern to the Lord and ask: Lord, how do you want me to think about this? Bring a habit you want to build or change and ask: Lord, give me strength to build this habit of charity or to change this habit of sin. The Eucharist has all the power and grace we could ever need to be saints. Today lift up your hearts to receive the Body of Christ, opening your soul to be that good soil in which Christ's life can grow freely and powerfully.
