It is with your faithfulness, abiding love, and resilient hope, that others come to see and to believe in the words of Jesus Christ. Simply put, your powerful witness ushers forth His kingdom in a world that desperately cries out for a Savior.

As the Lord calls me forth from this good place, be assured of my constant love and prayers. I know that I will see some of you again, but for many, our paths might never cross again. May we all be united again in heaven. My final words to you all remain what I shared daily from the Holy Mass:

May the peace of the Lord be with you always.
