A letter from your Holy Family priest | "I Am the Bread of Life"

The multiplication of the barley loaves and fish was a great sign performed by Jesus for those who followed him. The people were not only satisfied with what they ate but also were amazed at what Jesus did. Jesus offered those people a sign to see beyond, to see him as real food, but the people did not see the sign. They saw what Jesus did as a motivation to seek power. They wanted to make him king.

Certainly, there are so many materials needs in the world that are waiting to be transformed by us. I remember when I was beginning to decide on the path of priesthood. In a vocational retreat I was asked the following question: Why do you want to be a priest? And my answer was: "to help people," and my formator told me, "For that you don't need to be a priest, there are so many ways to help people." I understood that the main reason must be to follow Jesus and help others follow him.

The people that the Gospel tells us about, after the miracle of multiplication, began to follow Jesus, but unfortunately, their motivation was different, their motivation was material. Jesus challenges you to perfect your following of him, and he proposes such a challenge with these words: "work for the food that lasts for eternal life and that the Son of man will give you." What is that food that He will give us? It is nothing less than his own life: his divinity, his forgiveness, his gospel, his mission, his salvation, his love for his Father. Our great act of faith will be to say to the Lord: "Lord, always give us that bread."
