An Announcement on our Rectory Campaign

Dear Holy Family Catholic Community Parishioner(s),

Today, I am writing to you to let you know of an opportunity that has recently presented itself to Holy Family Catholic Community. As you know, due to deteriorating conditions at our current rectories, this year we began campaigning to build a new rectory at our Holy Family Church site where all of our priests could live in community. We were making great progress towards this \$2 million goal when we learned two things. Because of increased construction costs, the new rectory would cost between \$2.3-\$2.5 million when accounting for materials, construction, fixtures, and furniture.

Around the same time, we learned that a home down the road from Holy Family Church large enough to accommodate our priest team had gone up for sale. The nearly 9,000-square-foot home is situated on 51 acres of land across County Road K from Holy Family Church. While we know this rectory would not be on our current Holy Family Church land, it would expand our campus across County Road K and provide new and exciting opportunities for future development needs while at the same time providing a home for up to six priests.

Renovations are needed to convert the property from a home into a rectory, but the exciting news is that the cost of the home, surrounding acreage, and these changes will come in below our original goal of \$2 million. The rectory will also be move-in ready within a matter of months compared to the long wait of two years expected with new construction.

After many conversations with our staff and Rectory committee members and donors, we made the decision to pursue this property and are in the early stages of doing so. We believe this property meets all the hopes and expectations we had for building a new rectory, and, is as of right now, the most fiscally responsible decision for the parish.



A NEW VISION FOR A RECTORY

Would the prospective property give us what we need in a rectory?

	N E W R E C T O R Y	PROSPECTIVE RECTORY	
Location near the Holy Family site			While the prospective rectory is not part of the current Holy Family site, the property is visible from the church. The purchase would also expand the Holy Family site by adding 51 acres directly across County Road K.
Space for six priests to live in community			The prospective rectory offers more square footage — and acreage — than the newly constructed rectory would, allowing more than enough room for six priests to live, as well as for guests to visit.
New construction		X	Construction prices are increasing, making new construction very expensive. The prospective rectory is 21 years old. While repairs will be needed, the property was built with high-quality construction materials and is well maintained. Its roof was replaced in 2019 and appliances are relatively new.
Needs/amenities			Although the prospective rectory does not currently have all items in the rectory design plan, such as a chapel or the needed number of en suite bathrooms, renovations can bring them to fruition without going over budget.

A NEW VISION FOR A RECTORY

Would the prospective property give us what we need in a rectory?

Flexibility in future salability/rent	X		If in many years the parish no longer has as many priests serving it, the prospective rectory has much more flexibility for selling and renting than a rectory directly next to Holy Family Church. As the property is 51 acres, there are also opportunities to sell off or rent land for an additional source of income for the parish.
Move-in ready	X		We would most likely not be able to break ground on the new rectory until spring 2022, but the prospective rectory would be ready for move-in within months.
Growth opportunities	X		Fifty-one acres of land not only provide opportunities for selling and renting, but for expanding our Holy Family campus if future needs call for it.
Fiscally responsible for the parish	X		As stated above, construction costs have increased and placed the price of the rectory design \$500,000 over budget when accounting for construction, fixtures, and furniture. We believe that the purchase and renovations of the prospective rectory would come in at less than \$2 million.
