A letter from your Holy Family priest | "A sincere respect for your gifts"

Grant us, Lord, we pray, a sincere respect for your gifts. This is part of the Prayer over the Offerings that we heard at Mass this week. The Prayer over the Offerings is said after the priest sets the gifts of bread and wine on the altar. At that point the gifts of bread and wine truly become offerings (*oblations*) since they will be transformed into the perfect offering that was wrought, once and for all, on Calvary by Christ. This Sunday's Prayer over the Offerings remind us of the respect we show for this immense gift of God, that is, the tremendous transformation of bread and wine into Christ's Body and Blood.

It is often said that one drop of Our Lord's Blood could wash away the sins of the world. Hence, as our prayer invites us to, we pay *sincere respect* for the gift of our Lord's Body and Blood in the Most Holy Eucharist even when we are dealing with the drops in the chalice or the particles in the ciborium after Holy Communion. Whether the priest cleanses the vessels at the altar or if they are cleansed after Mass in the Sacristy, it is a careful process such that *sincere respect* is shown for the gift of Our Lord's Body which we receive at Mass.
