#### A letter from your Holy Family priest | New lights coming to Holy Family

Dear Holy Family Catholic Community Parishioner(s),

Thanks to recent donations made to the parish a long-standing issue at Holy Family Church will now have a viable solution to replace outdated and inefficient lighting.

Back when the church was built in 2007, we believed the choice of the fixtures with halogen lightbulbs would best suit our needs. Since then we have learned that this is not the case. Halogen lightbulbs produce heat, which our current light fixtures retain, causing bulbs to sometimes burn out within a few days of replacement. Not only does this leave us in the dark, but the heat makes it more difficult to cool the church, especially in the summer months.

These special bulbs are not easy to replace or easy to come by. These bulbs made in China used to take only a few days to receive, but as manufacturing and shipping delays occur throughout the world, this has stretched to months. When the bulbs do arrive, replacing them requires the work of a special lift, lift operator, and electrician and costs about \$2,000 each time. Due to this price, we only do this twice a year; but, between bulb replacements, Holy Family can become very dark as lights burn out.

On top of this, we are on borrowed time with our current system. Within a few years of installation, our dimming rack that controls the lighting system has become obsolete. For the past decade, it has become increasingly difficult to find replacement parts as they are no longer being made, and used parts are not readily available. If we are not able to fix the system, we may be without some or possibly all of our lights in the church. Our current system is not energy efficient or economical.

This is why we began to consider replacing our halogen fixtures with a LED lighting system. The system's bulbs use 75% less electricity while being 30% brighter, and because LEDs do not produce the head found in halogens, the bulbs are designed to last 30 years or more. As an added benefit, the fixtures are made right here in Wisconsin by Sheboygan's Manning Lighting, which produces fixtures for churches and cathedrals throughout the United States. The dimming board will come from the well-known ETC, a company that produces the technology used in many movie theatres and other large-scale areas, such as Disney. Unlike our current outdated system, ETC continues to replace and service its products from 25 years ago.

Already, the project has received approval from our Pastoral and Finance Councils, and no additional funds will be needed to pay for it. With the help of recent large donations designated for capital improvements projects, the entire cost of the project can be covered. We hope this improvement will make your experience at Holy Family even better, and we thank you and all our parishioners for their donations that help to fund needed projects such as this.
