# A letter from your Holy Family priest | "Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe"

Every time when I celebrate the solemnity of Christ the King of the Universe, the first mission to which I was assigned comes to mind. That was in 1995 when I was sent with two fellow priests to Venezuela. The parish that received us was called Cristo Rey. It was a new parish and people had the desire to buy an image of Christ the King. That was our first project as soon as we arrived, raising funds to buy the image.

When we had the money, we went to Colombia to buy the statue. Upon our arrival back at the parish with the image, the community gave us a great welcome. And so, the parish finally had Christ the King at church.

It was a beautiful image sculpted in wood, a king with his crown and his scepter, and under his feet, the world, to signify his power. That image is very far from what the Gospel offers us on this Sunday, a Jesus without scepter, without crown, and without the power of a conventional king. Even worse, he is a subjugated king, as the creed says, "He suffered under Pontius Pilate." But Jesus' power as our King is hidden in this passage. Definitely, the power of our king is different. He came to testify to the truth, to rule our hearts in his love, to reconcile us with his father. His power is in service. He is the kind of king that doesn't wash his hands before injustice. Rather, he bends his knee to wash the feet of his disciples. But above all things, our king has power over sin and death, he is the only one who can give us eternal life.

# SMSA students make cards to benefit child with brain tumor

Students in grades 4-8 at St. Mary's Springs Academy have created unique and original Christmas cards to benefit 9-year-old Mason, who has a brain tumor. These cards will be sold for \$2.00 after all the masses at Holy Family Parish sites December 4-5. Mason began having headaches and vision issues in 2018, and after tests and an MRI, they found a mass near his pituitary gland. As it was too risky to remove with surgery, they have been trying to shrink the tumor using chemo. Mason has lost almost all eyesight in his right eye, and now he is losing vision in his left. It is also pressing on his pituitary gland, which is causing it not to work properly. All proceeds from cards will benefit Mason. Please keep him and his family in your prayers.
