A letter from your Holy Family priest | November: Remembering and Praying for the Dead

Are you or I perfect? Probably not (though hopefully, by God's grace we are becoming a better person every day). Will we be perfect on the day of our death? Hopefully, but maybe not.

Fortunately, the universal Church has a day to help with this. This day was this past Tuesday, when the Church around the world celebrated All Souls' Day, Día de los Muertos, or "The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed."

On All Souls' Day, we are invited to do two things: remember and pray. We remember our deceased loved ones because we know that death does not separate them from the love we have for them. We pray because we know that death does not separate them from the love God has for them.

As Preface I from the funeral Mass says, "For your faithful, Lord, life is changed, not ended." Life does not end at death; our soul, what makes us who we are, that endures.

That soul, however, needs purification. Even when we die, "who we are" needs to be perfected. Psalm 24 says that to enter the presence of God, to "climb the mountain of the Lord," we must be "pure of heart" and "clean of hands." In other words, to enter heaven, we must be perfected, purified, made clean.

But God's mercy makes possible this purification, even after death. This is what we call Purgatory – the gift of God's merciful purification after our death. C.S. Lewis compared it to washing oneself before a luxurious meal – before the banquet of heaven, we need the purifying shower of purgatory. Through our prayers of intercession, we contribute to the pouring out of God's mercy in this purifying fire of Purgatory. So as we remember our beloved dead, we also pray for them.

Finally, it doesn't end on All Souls' Day. This entire month of November is a privileged time for these prayers. So during November, take some time to visit a cemetery and pray for those who you love that have died. Or say the Our Father and the Creed before or after Mass for the souls in purgatory. There's a plenary indulgence attached for both each day of November.

May God bless you! And may He bless all our loved ones who have gone before us in the peace of Christ. Amen.
