A letter from your Holy Family priest | "Joyful expectation" during Advent

This Third Sunday of Advent we celebrate *Gaudete* Sunday. *Gaudete*—the Latin for "Rejoice, all of you!"—reminds us of the joyful expectation we experience during this Advent Season. This Sunday, the priest trades the violet color, evocative of penance and mourning, with the rose chasuble. The color rose is used only twice a year, once during Advent and once during Lent. They remind us that during our preparation, which look forward in time, we presently live in the light of our Lord's nativity, passion, death, and resurrection. The rose color evokes an intensity to our preparation, spilling over into joy, knowing full well that God has kept His promise to *dwell among us* and He will keep His promise to come again in glory.

In our Gospel today, we are greeted again by Saint John the Baptist. The people, *filled with expectation*, asked Saint John the Baptist what needed to be done in order to prepare for the coming of the Messiah. Saint John the Baptist gives them some very concrete advice such as sharing with the poor, acting justly, and not grasping at material things. Saint John the Baptist is leading the crowd through an examination of conscience, an examination of their hearts. It was then that they were *filled with expectation* such that they even wondered if Saint John the Baptist was the Messiah! The Gospel today reveals to us the joy that results from an examination of conscience and seeking reconciliation.

A precept of the Church, that is, a responsibility of all Catholics, is to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation at least once per year (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, 1457). This Thursday, December 16th, Holy Family will be hosting "12 Hours of Reconciliation" from 8:00 am to 8:00 pm with numerous priests hearing confessions.
