A letter from your Holy Family priest | Working miracles "plain for all to see"

Last week, we celebrated our Lord's baptism. Jesus' baptism ushered in His public ministry. This week, in our Gospel, we heard what Jesus did *as the beginning of his signs at Cana in Galilee*, the transformation of water into wine. The Evangelist recounts that there was a lot of water turned to wine. If we do the math (*six stone water jars holding twenty to thirty gallons*) we arrive at something close to 150 gallons. What is at stake with such an amount?

For one, it is revealing that Jesus worked miracles that were plain for all to see. Saint John is revealing to us that Jesus did not effect a "party trick"- the kind of illusions I do when I play with my nieces and nephews. The miracles wrought by Jesus were done in public, before people, and on multiple occasions (for this is the first of many miracles of Jesus). The earliest Christians would be able to speak with the recipients of such wonders of God's grace. The witnesses of Jesus' miracles had the same use of reason that we do. Yet, apparently there was enough evidence, as the Gospel consistently reveals, for crowds to flock to Him.

But there is another lesson for us. 150 gallons means that there were a lot of people at the wedding, which makes Mary's request that much more special. *They have no wine*, she said. The Gospel reveals to us that Mary was observant, always seeking the good of others. But even more amazing was that the extravaganza of the party, the people, and the celebration, did not keep Mary from being attentive to the needs of others. We can say, I surmise, that Mary was not aloof, standing in the corner waiting to converse with someone and just happened to notice the crisis of the lack of wine unfolding. On the contrary, I would like to think that Mary, the Immaculate, the sinless Mother of God, would have drawn so many people into her circle of friendship by Her purity of heart that she scarcely had a moment to herself. Yet, the Gospel reveals, she could tell that the wine was running low, and interceded on the behalf of others, so that Jesus would work a miracle in their lives.
