*A letter from your Holy Family priest | "Today this Scripture Passage is Fulfilled in your Hearing"*

There is a story of a Franciscan priest who was designated as a guide for Mother Teresa of Calcutta during her visit to Australia. The father was enthusiastic and excited about the opportunity to be close to this great woman, and he dreamed of learning a lot in her company. During her visit, Mother Teresa was in such high demand that he did not have time to talk to her. When she finished her visit she was on her way to New Guinea and this priest asked her: "Mother Teresa if I pay for my ticket, can I accompany you and sit next to you and learn your teachings?" Mother Teresa replied: "If you have money to pay for the trip, give the money to the poor and you will learn more than I can teach you."

Mother Teresa understood the ministry of Jesus, she made it her own and put it into practice. In this world, there are plenty of preachers, but those who fulfill the Scripture are lacking. In the Gospel of this Sunday, Jesus went to Nazareth, his town, among his relatives, friends, and acquaintances. He went to the synagogue, that was his custom. That day became special, as Jesus opened the book, Isaiah, and read the Scripture and defined himself as the Servant of Isaiah. "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me..." the eyes of all in the synagogue looked intently at him, Jesus was there not only to read the text but to fulfill it. Jesus became the living good news to the poor, to captives, to the blind, to the oppressed, and to all who embrace his gospel. Our meditation for this week is to be brave. Let's not be content with just hearing or reading the gospel, let's put it into practice in our daily lives as Jesus did.
