A letter from your Holy Family priest | "Holy water has a great depth of meaning"

Today, the feast of the Baptism of the Lord, is a great time to examine one of the constant features of every Catholic church and of many Catholic homes: Holy Water.

Holy water has a great depth of meaning. It recalls the **Flood** (death to sin), it recalls the **Red Sea** (freedom from all forms of slavery), and it recalls Moses giving **water in the desert** (new strength for the journey of life). But most of all it recalls the Person who promised his followers "living water," that is to say, Jesus Christ. It reminds us of Christ who in his baptism was not sanctified by water, but rather sanctified water itself.¹

Holy water is primarily a reminder of baptism. It reminds us of Jesus' baptism, when the Father spoke to him and said "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well-pleased." It reminds us of our own baptism, and a reminder that we are incorporated into Christ's death and resurrection and that God has claimed us also as His beloved sons and daughters. Baptism is the "gateway to the spiritual life," and so we often put our baptismal font or our holy water fonts at the entryway to our churches as a reminder of how our life in Christ began.

But holy water is not just a reminder; it is also a sacramental. It has been blessed by a deacon or priest and so, by the Church's intercessory prayer, prepares us to receive grace and to cooperate with grace.² St. Thomas Aquinas wrote that the sprinkling of holy water actually leads to the remission of venial sins.³ This is because holy water is an occasion of God's grace by the Church's intercessory prayer, and taking holy water on our part is an action by which we express a rejection of sin and a reverence for God.

I don't want to flood you with too many details. But this weekend, when you dip your finger in the holy water font, remember the meaning of this water. And ask the Lord to renew your baptism, so that you can live this week with him, as a beloved child of God, "with whom He is well-pleased."
