A letter from your Holy Family Priest | "Prodigal Daughter"

Last Sunday we heard the gospel of the prodigal son and this Sunday of the adulterous woman. It seems that there is not much difference between that young man, and this woman, both have immersed themselves in sin. If we called the young man of last week was called the Prodigal Son, with all that he did, then why not call the woman this Sunday the "**Prodigal Daughter**"?

Certainly, she deserved punishment, but these scribes and Pharisees had evil intentions. They partially applied what the Law prescribed in Dt. 22: 22 says: "If a man is discovered lying with a woman who is married to another, they both shall die, the man who was lying with the woman as well as the woman. Thus, shall you purge the evil from Israel." But in this scene we only see the woman caught in flagrant adultery and so the question comes, where is the man, the adulterer? Jesus knew perfectly well what Deuteronomy mandated, but he didn't want to play the game of the scribes and Pharisees; he was silent.

He began to write on the ground with his finger, with calm, with wisdom and attached to the spirit of the Law made justice. His sentence was that spectacular phrase: "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her."

So, from that moment, no one can throw either the first or the second stone. Only Jesus, the man without sin and with clean hands, could have thrown the first stone, instead, he said: "Neither do I condemn you. Go, and from now on do not sin anymore."
