A letter from your Holy Family Priest | Pray for our catechumens and candidates

Brothers and sisters,

Before a man is ordained a priest, he must spend 5-8 years in preparation and learning. Before a couple receive the sacrament of marriage, they must spend months or even years in preparation through dating and the period of engagement. Before Confirmation, students must spend time in preparation. The point is this: the gifts of God require us to receive them with a right disposition, and so each sacrament requires a period of preparation.

There is a group of people in our parish going through this type of preparation right now. They are our 9 catechumens and 8 candidates. The catechumens are preparing for Baptism, Confirmation, and First Communion at the Easter Vigil; the candidates are preparing for Confirmation and full reception into the Catholic Church.

This group has been preparing since the fall, and this Sunday marks an intensification of their preparation. They have entered into the "Period of Purification and Enlightenment," which began with their Rite of Election three weeks ago. Now, as the Easter Vigil gets closer, the Church asks those in preparation to make the process more personal. It is a time to progress "in genuine self-knowledge through serious examination of their lives and true repentance." So the elect now ask themselves: How has my journey into the Church been the result, not just of my own ideas, but of God's guidance? What obstacles in my mind and heart keep me from hearing God's voice and following His will?

The ritual this Sunday, which will be occur during the 10:00 am Mass at Holy Family, includes prayers and an exorcism for the elect. It asks the Lord Jesus, "in the power of your name, which we call upon in faith, stand by them now and heal them. Rule over that spirit of evil, conquered by your rising from the dead."

So please pray for these 17 men and women! They are walking a journey toward real union with God in the Catholic Church, and they need our prayers and encouragement as well as the protection of the Church.

And may God bless you as you continue your own journey toward Easter. Like the catechumens and candidates, may you become free from sin, distraction, and fear, and find the joy of encountering the living and resurrected Lord Jesus.
