A letter from your Holy Family Priest | "The greatest expression of Divine Mercy"

On a recent Confirmation retreat, we took an informal poll to see what word the high schoolers associated most with the Sacrament of Confession. The top two vote-getters? "Intimidating" and "Scary."

Confession doesn't win many Sacrament popularity contests. This fact is unfortunate for a variety of reasons, but it's particularly unfortunate today when the message of confession is needed more than ever. The message is this: God loves imperfect people. Or in other words: You can be a good person, beloved by God, and still have committed sins that need to be recognized and rejected.

This is perhaps news to us, because we often treat this like an either/or:

"I'm a good person, Father." Yes, I know. Confession is about the times when you chose not to act as your true, good, God-given self. Those are called "sins," and if you think you haven't committed any of those, please read 1 John 1:10.

Or the other extreme: "I've failed and I am a failure." No, you are not a failure. You may have failed in certain actions, but your failures pale in comparison to the love God has for you and the goodness He has given you. And if you don't believe that's how God sees you, please read Isaiah 43:4.

So there is a double reality: we are created good and yet have acted against our God-given goodness. To heal this reality requires the forgiveness of sins, a forgiveness which Jesus suffered and died to win, and a power which Jesus conveys to the disciples today: "Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them" (John 20:23).

This is sacrament of Confession. It is the power to forgive sins, given to the disciples gathered in the upper room. It is the greatest expression of Divine Mercy – a Mercy which we need, and which God longs to give us.

"Scary" or "intimidating" are good words for Confession, but mostly because those are the only words to describe the love of a God who would be crucified to win forgiveness for each of us.
