A letter from your Holy Family Priest | "Each Sunday, we have the chance to encounter Jesus"

Sunday is the first day of the week! In a speech to the clergy of Rome in 2013, Pope Benedict XVI reminded us that each Sunday is an opportunity for a fresh start:

"Again and again we begin our time with the Resurrection, our encounter with the Risen one, and from that encounter with the Risen one we go out into the world. In this sense, it is a pity that these days Sunday has been transformed into the weekend, although it is actually the first day, it is the beginning; we must remind ourselves of this: it is the beginning, the beginning of Creation and the beginning of re-Creation in the Church, it is an encounter with the Creator and with the Risen Christ."

Each Sunday we have the chance to encounter Jesus, the Risen one. And this, if we let it, can be the beginning of new life for us. Each Sunday is thus a new beginning – the first day of the week.

Over the last couple of months, we have celebrated the Easter Season, giving thanks for Jesus' resurrection. We have recalled Pentecost, celebrated the Holy Trinity, and honored the gift of Christ's Body and Blood in the Eucharist. All these are great feasts; they are like the "Sunday" of the whole year. But now we begin the work of bringing the meaning of these feasts into our ordinary lives. And so we begin Ordinary Time – a time for living out Christ's death and resurrection in our ordinary lives.

This means that every suffering we undergo is something we can hold up before God alongside Christ's sufferings on the cross. Every joy that fills our life is a joy we in fact share with Christ the Risen one. When we have needs and are waiting for God, we are not waiting alone, but we wait with the disciples and Mary in the upper room, knowing that the Holy Spirit came upon them at Pentecost and that the same Holy Spirit will come upon us. Every day, we suffer with Jesus, we triumph with Jesus, and we ask for the Spirit of Jesus to come upon our world.

It's a different kind of living, but that is what Sunday begins. The story of Jesus – his suffering, death, and resurrection – is meant to become the story of each Catholic. We have celebrated his victory in Easter and in the recent feast days, and we continue to celebrate it each Sunday. Now is time for us (as the Knights of Columbus say) to "live Jesus" in our daily lives. We've celebrated Sunday, but Sunday is just the first day of the week.
