Give school supplies to area children in need!

This summer, Holy Family Catholic Community is joining with organizations around Fond du Lac County to collect school supplies for 1,200 area children with the Back to School FDL program! Beginning this weekend, we are asking you to help us in this effort by donating school supplies and dropping them off in boxes marked for Back to School FDL at all of our Holy Family sites through July 31. Needed items include: 1-inch binders, calculators (TI 30X IIS), colored pencils, Crayola washable markers, pink erasers, dry erase markers, glue/glue sticks, graph paper, highlighters, 3x5 index cards, loose-leaf paper, no. 2 pencils, pencil bags, pocket folders, rulers, 7-inch scissors, Sharpie markers, sketch books, spiral notebooks, and watercolor paints. A letter from your Holy Family Priest | "It is a gift to be a priest"

Dear Friends,

Praised be Jesus Christ!

Because I look to so many priest alumni of Holy Family as both friends and spiritual fathers, I should have anticipated that I too would one day be able to serve as a priest here in Fond du Lac!

After spending this past year as an associate pastor at four parishes in the city of Milwaukee, in addition to working to complete further theological studies, it's a joy for me to begin my second assignment here at Holy Family.

The oldest of four children, I grew up in Colgate (near Holy Hill) and began seminary formation for the Archdiocese of Milwaukee after graduating from Marquette University High School.

It was during high school while in Eucharistic Adoration on a semi-silent canoe retreat in the summer before my junior year that I received the Lord's invitation to draw closer to Him, which manifested itself as a desire to discern priesthood and to do so intentionally after graduation.

After spending four years in college seminary at Loyola University in Chicago, I had the privilege to continue my formation in Rome, where I overlapped with the familiar names here of Fr. John LoCoco, Fr. John Paul Mitchell, and Fr. Justin Weber.

Although my time in Rome was cut short because of the beginning of the pandemic, I received the singular grace to complete my priestly formation at our own Archdiocesan seminary, St. Francis de Sales, in whose chapel I was ordained a transitional deacon in April of 2020, and from whose venerable grounds I was called to priestly ordination at our Cathedral in May of 2021.

It's a gift to be a priest. I so look forward to spending these years at Holy Family.
