A letter from your Holy Family Priest | "Stumbling Blocks"

The readings of the Mass this Sunday are not easy to understand. Our first reading from the Book of the Prophet Jeremiah is not only filled with unfamiliar names, such as Zedekiah, Prince Malchiah, and Ebed-melech, but it also contains the strange action of throwing Jeremiah into a cistern only to take him out again. The second reading, from the Letter to the Hebrews, uses a lot of imagery to speak of the endurance required of the Christian. For example, we heard of a "cloud of witnesses." Finally, in the Gospel, Jesus speaks in words that may sound jarring to us, and difficult to reconcile as coming from the one who was prophesied as the "prince of peace." What does Jesus mean when he says, "do you think that I have come to establish peace on the earth? No, I tell you, but rather division."

Why are the Scriptures sometimes difficult to understand? Many of the earliest theologians of the Church, the Church Fathers, spoke of these difficult passages as "stumbling blocks." The Holy Spirit, in inspiring the sacred authors, introduced difficult passages which cause us to slow down and to think deeply about God's Word. These "stumbling blocks" help prevent us from treating all of Scripture in a superficial way. Otherwise if we read the Bible or books of the Bible once, we would think that somehow that would be enough, that we totally understood the mystery of who God is, His revelation to us, and His love for us. These "stumbling blocks" work to remind us that the Scriptures contain an inexhaustible wealth of truth helping us to grow in love of God and neighbor.

So what is the Christian to do when faced with a difficult passage? In order to help us understand the Scriptures correctly, Christ empowers His Church to guide us in interpreting correctly these difficult passages. This is accomplished through the teaching office of the Church- the Magisterium. But as disciples of Christ, we too are called to assist one another in a deeper understanding of the inexhaustible mystery of our faith. For this reason, Holy Family is richly blessed to have many small groups that regularly meet to pray, reflect, and discuss the mystery of our faith. I highly encourage you to check out these groups as we help one another come to the knowledge of truth.
