A letter from your Holy Family Priest | "Where your treasure is..."

"Where your treasure is, there your heart will be." These words of Jesus never fail to convict me. Is my heart truly with Jesus?

I had a glimpse of what it looks like to give one's heart to the Lord a couple weeks ago when I went on a mission trip with twenty-one college students and FOCUS missionaries. Those students placed their treasures - their time, their energy, their money – with the Lord. They gave up sleep, cultural familiarity, and the basic comforts associated with running water to serve God's people. Their hearts in those days truly belonged to God. And God's presence was revealed among them in the fruits of the Holy Spirit – patience, courage, humility, and deep joy.

My point is not just to praise God for the past, but to look to the present. I want to invite you to make the same decision those missionaries did: to place your treasure in the Lord and to give your heart to Jesus.

This is our constant quest as Catholics, but how do we make it concrete? Giving our hearts to Jesus sounds good, but what should one actually do? Well, over the next two weeks our parish is offering a particular opportunity to place our treasure in the Lord. This is the opportunity to sign up for a group Bible study.

Perhaps the hardest treasure for us to give up is our time. "Life is so busy," we hear all the time. Indeed, when we make time for God a priority, we are giving God our most precious treasure. But when we give God the treasure of our time, our hearts will remain with Him. And God is never outdone in generosity; He will lead us to conversion of heart and deep peace, courage, patience, and joy. And as we consistently give our hearts to God, we will find that the words of Jesus truly apply to God and us: "Amen, I say to you, he will gird himself, have them recline at table, and proceed to wait on them."

An Update on Refugee Families at Holy Family

Dear Holy Family Catholic Community Parishioner(s),

Earlier this summer, we shared with you that Holy Family Catholic Community would be assisting families who are seeking refuge in the United States as they get settled in their new home. This is work that we are honored to do and we wanted to update you on our progress thus far.

Back in June, we learned that multiple refugee families had arrived in Fond du Lac and needed shelter. As refugees, these families arrived here out of no fault of their own, but because of the dangerous and deadly persecution they endured in their home countries which put them at risk of being victims of serious human rights violations. Some not only faced the risk, but had their rights violated. With few choices to protect their lives and without a government to protect them from danger, they bravely decided to make the difficult journey to the United States and legally seek safety and citizenship here, as refugees have the right to international protection.

In these families, we recognized need, and in our old rectories, a way to help. We've utilized the St. Peter Rectory as a temporary shelter for the families, and will soon move them to the former St. Mary's Rectory, located inside what is now the Holy Family Outreach Center, where they will stay until they can find housing. Holy Family has collaborated with Solutions Center to fund the renovations at the former rectory, as like our other old rectories, it would not be livable long-term without them.

Here, we are offering a place of community to families who have had to leave theirs. It's a place where we can connect them with all the services they need to make their way in the United States, provided by the helping hands of Fond du Lac including the Solutions Center, St. Vincent de Paul, Fond du Lac Literacy Services, SSM Health at St. Agnes Hospital, and more. The benefits extend to those at the St. Katharine Drexel Shelter as well. As Holy Family welcomes these families, the shelter will have the additional space needed to move those it is better suited to serve off its waiting list and inside its doors.

Through our collective efforts, many more people will receive the care they need in a faster manner than they would've otherwise. That is something we all can find joy in, and we offer you our gratitude as your support has been an integral part in making it happen. Through your generosity in our campaign to purchase our new rectory, we now have the ability to reach further into our community and provide more help with our old rectories. Thank you.
