Satisfying spiritual and physical hunger

Every Sunday, we invite our parishioners to feed their souls by attending Mass and receiving Communion, the source and summit of our Faith. As we make this offering throughout the week, our Human Concerns Ministry also seeks to satisfy the physical hunger of those in need with our participation in various food programs.

Just as the Holy Family Outreach Center began during the pandemic, our meal-to-go program, Blessed Bites did as well. Seeing the number of people in need of food increasing and the number of available food programs shrinking, we started our Blessed Bites program out St. Mary's Church in September 2020. Every Tuesday, anyone who is in need of a meal is welcome to come to St. Mary's to receive a free to-go meal donated by generous, caring parishioners like you! In addition to this meal, those who come to Blessed Bites can choose from a selection of boxed and canned goods, as well as hygiene care and cleaning items to help them through the week. As we mark this program's two-year anniversary this month, we are thankful for everyone who has helped us to keep Blessed Bites running and serving dozens of people each week.

Throughout the summer, volunteers also help to power the Brown Bag Lunch Program. A collaboration between Holy Family and The Salvation Army of Fond du Lac County, the Brown Bag Lunch Program provides lunches to children and families on Tuesdays and Thursdays during the summer months to help fill the gap left for those relying on school lunches. With your donations of items like peanut butter, water bottles, and crackers, our volunteers were able to pack and distribute hundreds of meals - 300 to be exact - on Tuesdays.

This program is not our only community meal collaboration. Four times a year, our Human Concerns Ministry participates in Loaves and Fishes. Serving hot meals twice a week out of Church of Peace, Loaves and Fishes reaches 300 to 400 of our community members and is one of Fond du Lac's oldest meal programs, beginning in 1982 with the first meal served from St. Joseph's Church. We consider it a privilege that we are able to participate in Loaves and Fishes and help them in our shared mission of feeding the hungry.

Our food programs go beyond those who are ailing from hunger. In times of grief and sickness, our Food & Comfort Ministry works to ensure families and individuals do not have to worry about meals. A team of volunteers makes and delivers hot meals up to three days a week at no cost to parishioners who are sick, grieving, or recuperating. Through this program, and all of our meal outreach initiatives, we are guided by Isaiah 58:10-11: "If you extend your soul to the hungry, and satisfy the afflicted soul, then your light shall dawn in the darkness, and your [a]darkness shall be as the noonday."
