Caring for ill and elderly

One of the main focuses of our Human Concerns Ministry—and the Catholic Church as a whole—is to care for the most vulnerable in our society. This includes those who are sick and the elderly. Our care for those in these populations spans a wide range of efforts, from bringing a smile to bringing Communion. With the help of volunteers, all of our parishioners age 80 and up receive greeting cards throughout the year, wishing them a happy birthday and letting them know that their parish—and a fellow parishioner—is thinking about them at major holidays like Christmas and Easter. Some of these cards are handmade by volunteers as well, adding another personal touch to this happy ministry.

Volunteers power many of our outreach efforts. A prime example of this is our Neighbors in Faith program. The program pairs parishioners who would like to volunteer their time and parishioners who are in need of help with tasks around their home, such as lawn work, cleaning, shoveling, and getting groceries, as well as getting to Mass or just having some time for companionship. Thus far, the program has been a success in not only accomplishing much needed jobs, but also forming relationships between our parishioners.

For parishioners who are unable to leave their home to make it to Mass, or who now live in a nursing home, our volunteers and our priest team work together to serve them. Our giving volunteers make visits to dozens of parishioners to bring them the Body of Christ in our homebound Communion ministry. This ministry became even more important in the lives of our parishioners during the pandemic when many, due to age or health conditions, were unable to join us at Mass. For our parishioners who now call long-term care or nursing home facilities home, our priest team offers monthly Mass at the facilities that request it so they can remain connected to the Mass and Holy Family. In times of illness, we offer our care through the Sacraments, specifically that of Anointing the Sick. Our priest team comes to the bedside of those who are ailing to offer the Sacrament, which confers God's grace through the Holy Spirit on those who are ill and brings spiritual and even physical strength during an illness, especially near the time of death.

These ministries not only fulfill faith needs, but also the human need for connection and community. This is of particular importance when people are navigating grief. Each year, we offer multiple sessions of our Grief Share program, which acts as a support group and helps participants find their way through loss with others who are doing the same. We also recently started the group Widows Reaching out to Widows, bringing together women who have lost their husbands to share their experiences and help one another.
