Reaching into our jails and prisons

As you have seen over the past few weeks, our Human Concerns Ministry extends a helping hand to many groups of people: those who are hungry and without homes; those grieving the loss of a loved one or dealing with illness; those who are homebound and are seeking connection to the Church; and those who just need a bit of help, be with a task or connecting to God.

It is in that final group that our Prison/Jail Ministry and outreach lie. Once a month, a team of 2-3 volunteers visit the women at Taycheedah Correctional Institution, just up the road from Holy Family Church, and "Break Open the Word" with them, sharing the Gospel and kindness during these meetings.

Our priest team goes each week to Taycheedah and twice a month to Waupun Correctional Institution to provide Scripture and Communion service to anyone there who is interested. When requested, we also provide Bibles, Rosaries, and opportunities for Reconciliation. If there are people who would like to join the Catholic Church, or who did not receive all the Sacraments, such as Holy First Communion or Confirmation, we will work with them to fulfill their goal through our RCIA, or Rites of Christian Initiation, program offered in the spring.

Through this program, we are given the opportunity to see another way in which God can heal and bring joy. These acts of offering Mass and breaking open the Word at our local jails and prisons can offer hope to those who are incarcerated, help them find faith again if they have lost it, and rehabilitate themselves, so hopefully, when they return home, they will not return to their previous acts.

In this important ministry, we seek to reflect the words of Matthew 25:36,40: "I was in prison and you visited me ... Whatever you did for the least of my people, you did for me."
