Helping those in need at the Holy Family Outreach Center

Throughout the month of September, we would like to take the opportunity to spotlight the various facets that comprise our Human Concerns Ministry. Much of the outreach that Holy Family does within our community is organized by Human Concerns. From our serving communion to our homebound members, to providing food to those in need through our meal-to-go program, Blessed Bites, to bringing the word of God to those imprisoned, Human Concerns does it all!

This week, we are going to spotlight the work of our Holy Family Outreach Center. Like many of our newer programs, the Holy Family Outreach Center sprung out of the pandemic. As various locations those in our homeless community turned to for shelter had to restrict access because of the pandemic, Holy Family opened its doors to welcome those in need. At first using St. Mary's Church for shelter, Holy Family renovated the lower level of the former St. Mary's Rectory in late 2020/early 2021 to create a space more suitable for the homeless in our area and connect them with community resources to help them begin to rebuild their lives. Over the past couple of winters, we have been able to help multiple find housing and jobs, get phones, and begin treatment for addiction.

This summer, another opportunity for us to help presented itself. Fond du Lac began to receive multiple refugee families who were fleeing dangerous and deadly persecution in their home countries, and did not have their own government to protect them. Coming to the United States legally, they sought safety and a new life. Knowing their need for shelter, Holy Family once again turned to former St. Mary's Rectory/current Outreach Center. In collaboration with The Solutions Center of Fond du Lac, we renovated the former rectory to make it livable, and in collaboration with various community organizations, are connecting these refugee families with the resources to help them as they begin anew here in America. These resources are helping them to learn English, find jobs, and, of course, become part of our Fond du Lac community.

The families are very grateful for our help, and we are grateful to you for the ability you provide us to do such meaningful work in Fond du Lac with your support. Through you, we are living out the words of Jesus found in Matthew 25:34-36: "Come, you who are blessed by my Father; take your inheritance, the kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me."
