Brothers and sisters in Christ,

In today’s first reading from Exodus, we hear of Moses engaging in powerful intercessory prayer on behalf of Joshua and the Israelite forces. Moses raises his hands and prays; as long as he does so, Israel’s warriors prevail. But Moses cannot carry this burden alone, so two others – Aaron and Hur – stand alongside him, holding his arms up for the duration of the fight. *“And Joshua,”* the sacred author concludes, *“mowed down Amalek and his people with the edge of the sword.”*

Aaron and Hur stand alongside Moses at this altar of intercession. As Catholics, this should be a familiar picture to us. In the Mass, as the priest prays and offers to God the Father the holy sacrifice of Christ’s Body and Blood, someone else stands next to him, assisting in this sacred task. This man is the Deacon.

Deacon comes from the Greek word *diakonos*, which means “servant.” The Deacon stands as a sacramental presence of Christ the Servant, reminding us that “the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve” (Matthew 20:28).

We are blessed in our parish with one active deacon, Deacon Dale Paczkowski, and one retired deacon, Deacon Ricardo Muñoz. Their work has been instrumental for our community. But I want you to know that another is preparing to join their ranks: Marty Ryan, a longtime parishioner of Holy Family and resident of Fond du Lac.

Marty is a gifted speaker and leader, a man of generosity, and a deeply prayerful and committed Catholic man. He and his wife, Diane, are a beautiful couple – married for many years, faithful to prayer and the sacraments. Together they have gone through the discernment year and together they have participated in a year of formation. It has not been easy. But amid the drives down to Milwaukee, learning theology, writing papers, and – perhaps most importantly – in prayer, Diane and Marty have repeatedly experienced confirmation of Marty’s call to the permanent diaconate.

Marty is receiving the Ministry of Acolyte on October 15 at the Mary Mother of the Church Pastoral Center in Milwaukee. Two years from now, God willing, he will be ordained a permanent Deacon. Please keep him, his wife and family in your prayers as they continue to pursue God’s will for them. And may all of us be inspired to imitate Christ, who came among us “as one who serves” (Luke 22:27).
