The basic rules – Obedience and Humility

One of the most important rules of life that each Christian should try is to be obedient and humble and incorporate those qualities deeper and deeper our lives. Obedience is love to God's will. On the contrary, disobedience is always a disaster. Just remember the disobedience of our first fathers, Adam and Eve. Any action in our lives have consequences and we must live according to the plan that God have for our lives.

Etymologically, obedience in Biblical Hebrew, the word obey means "shama," to hear, but also to keep, or observe the commandments (Exodus 16:28, 34:11), and walking the God's ways (1 Kings 11:33). So, the observance of obedience to God should be central in our lives, especially for those who are trying to follow Jesus.

All of us should have the disposition to obey which is an action of love. Thus, God is inviting you to open your heart and be open to the possibility to be guided by the Holy Spirit and hear God's voice in our inner selves. When I affirm through the Holy Spirit it is because only after the apostle's experience on Pentecost, they could fully be sent to the mission and to understand the words and ministry of Jesus Christ.

Only through obedience is it possible to answer God's call to be holy as he is holy (1 Peter 1:16). However, the holiness is a way, a journey, not a goal itself. Therefore, obedience is related to faith (for instance Abraham, Moses, Isaiah and others), humility and imitation of Jesus Christ, who like a little child crying out to the Father, "My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from me, yet, not as I will but your will" (Matthew 26:39) surrenders totally his will to God-the Father's will. We also see the humility of Our Lady Mary, the mother of God and our mother, when she accepts the God's will and God's plan is her life, saving to the Angel in the annunciation of Jesus Christ "May it be done according to your word (Luke 1:38).

When Our Lady said those words, she was accepting with humility the God's will in her life, not for herself but to cooperate with God in his salvation plan for all humanity. Thus, when we are listening to the word of God through obedience, we can not only freely to respond to his call, but also cooperate in God's plan of salvation for humankind.

Obedience consists of doing God's will (Deut. 1-4; Eccless. 12:13) because only by humility, freely loving, and kind obedience will we please God. It is means to obey for love and with love (the rules of Saint Benedict, chapter V), but is it impossible out of love because God responds with love (Isiah 1:19).

So, this kind of obedience is based on the gifts of the Holy Spirit, especially related to fear of God. We should be open to the Holy Spirit and to receive his gifts and be aware that obedience also implies a responsibility toward God. Nevertheless, if we want to grow in an intimacy relationship with God, obedience is of great importance and a fundamental part of our lives to interpretation our relationship with God.
