A letter from your priest | "The central joy of heaven is life in and with God without any fear or loss"

The Chosen People had a challenging time understanding the afterlife. Over the centuries, debate arose around this question. In the second century before Christ, a greater clarity developed around the time of the account of the Maccabee family. The story of the faith-filled Maccabee family offered inspiring examples of their heroism.

The Seleucids waged limitless wars on the Jews, centering on Jewish beliefs and practices. The test of a Jewish son's faith centers on his observance of Jewish dietary laws. The law was sacred and serious; dedicated observance was a matter of conscience.

In today's reading, all the sons resist to the end with their mother's encouragement. One son affirms the hope of the resurrection of the dismembered body. In fact, the willingness of all the sons to endure torture and death hinges on their belief in a resurrection of the body.

St. Paul, trying to quell the rising fears and instability among the Thessalonians, in today's second reading, emphasizes the future hope gained by Christ's death and resurrection, which stands as a solid platform for present-day behavior and demeanor.

In the Gospel, Jesus is speaking to Sadducees who do not believe in the resurrection of the dead and the Pharisees who do. Of course, Jesus counsels them to believe in the resurrection.

Jesus sees what is happening and is intrigued by their thinking of translating marriage from a present life happening into resurrection terms, Jesus takes this opportunity to weave the thought of life after death into the fabric of the Christian faith.

We do not know much about our future life in heaven. What we do know from Jesus' teachings is that it is vastly greater than this present life. Why? The central joy of heaven is life in and with God without any fear or loss.

St. Francis de Sales gave us an important uplifting insight. He writes, "It is a consolation to know that the friendships begun on earth will continue in heaven."

He says this because God is love, and when we love others, we are showing our love for God too. Jesus himself adds this to our mindfulness. He upholds resurrected life as a reward freely given. Jesus also challenges any thinking that would model future life on our present existence and fail to appreciate the transformation involved in the passage to a brand-new existence.
