2022 was a busy year for projects, more to come in 2023

2022 was a busy year for our Buildings and Grounds crew as they worked to maintain our six church sites, ensuring that they remain beautiful, functional, and accessible for all our parishioners.

One of our most eye-catching renovations of the year was paid for as a memorial from a long-time parishioner: the moving of stained-glass windows to the front of Our Risen Savior Church. Behind the altar, these windows, which once belonged to St. Mary's Church in Eldorado, are lit artificially to make it look like the sun is always pouring through them. We also made exterior repairs to Our Risen Savior after a tree fell and caused damage to the roof and gutter, as well as door entrances.

We, too, addressed the exterior of Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary Church by fixing its leaking outdoor gutters. Presentation, along with Sacred Heart, Our Risen Savior, and St. Mary had their boilers repaired this past year, helping to keep the sites warm during brutal cold spells.

As you may have noticed at Sacred Heart, we installed much needed new windows in the front entrance, and this year, we will put the finishing touches on them when we paint the trim. Over at St. Peter, a few coats of paint have given the Sanctuary a fresh look. Outside, we made repairs to the roof, replacing missing shingles.

Thanks to two very generous donors, we were able to install new carpet in the hallway, living room, and stairway at the St. Mary Rectory, improvements necessary to make the space livable for the refugee families temporarily calling it home.

At Holy Family, we replaced the worn carpet in Confession area, Usher's Room, Bride's Room, and Fireside Room. Further flooring repairs became needed when unexpected shifting caused tiles in the bathroom, church, and hallways to buckle. One of our biggest projects at Holy Family this year was installing handicap accessible doors in our Parish Office, making visits to our office easier for those who need its services.

We have more projects planned in 2023, including repairs to the St. Mary's stonework, painting louvers and gutters at Presentation, replacing the boiler and air conditioning systems at St. Peter, and installing new windows at Our Risen Savior. We would like to thank our Buildings and Grounds Committee and maintenance staff who help to identify these projects and carry them to completion.

Of course, we could make none of these repairs or improvements to our parish without your generous support, and for it we are incredibly thankful. Thank you for all you do to help us keep Holy Family Catholic Community up and running!
