#### A letter from your Holy Family priest | "Lord, I love you."

This past Thursday, Pope Benedict XVI was laid to rest. These past couple of weeks have provided an opportunity to hear again his many incisive words. In his first Encyclical, *Deus Caritas Est* (God is Love), Benedict XVI reminded us that "being Christian is not the result of an ethical choice or a lofty idea, but the encounter with an event, a person, which gives life a new horizon and a decisive direction." In his last testament, released upon his passing, he encouraged all of us to, "stand firm in the faith! Do not be confused!" He continued, writing that despite the supposed "progress" of rationalism, political ideologies, and progressive though heterodox theology, that in his long life, "I have seen seemingly unshakeable theses collapse [...] and see, how, out of the tangle of hypotheses, the reasonableness of faith has emerged and is emerging anew. Jesus Christ is truly the Way, the Truth, and the Life – and the Church, in all Her shortcomings, is truly His Body." But aside from his theological acumen, what struck me most were his final words.

According to nurses, Benedict XVI's last words were, "Lord, I love you." Friends, we cannot take these words for granted. We should not suppose that when death is near, these words will be easy to call to mind and speak aloud. When all else is stripped away by failing health, frailty, and sickness, what shores up our innermost self is exposed (c.f. Mt 7:24-29). I once anointed a person whom I (still) consider incredibly faithful. When I asked them about their prayer during a difficult stay in the hospital, this individual lifted their eyes to me and said, "Father, it is so difficult to pray when you are sick." I was shaken. I had assumed that for this person, when "times were tough," prayer would come easily. That when one was closest to suffering, it would be easy to unite that suffering to the Suffering One of Jesus Christ. But I was wrong. It is precisely in those difficult moments that the consolation of prayer can be distant. We need not be surprised, for our Lord Himself, on the cross cried out, "My God, my God, why have you abandoned me" (c.f. Ps 22)? It is not easy to pray when the most foundational things we cling to-including independence, comfort, language, life, etc.-escape our grasp.

This is why Pope Benedict XVI's last words are so inspiring. To say, "Lord, I love you" at the final moments of one's life reveals an inner core of faith built up and set upon a sturdy foundation. Friends, death is something that we must prepare for. It is imperative to prepare while we are well, while we are healthy, while we have control. Numerous times when I visit someone close to death, an otherwise unresponsive patient will "light up" when we recite the Our Father, the Hail Mary, or simply the Sign of the Cross. These prayers "get in our bones" and build up an inner core of faith that will last to the end. But they also shape our minds and hearts to keep God in focus throughout our day-reminding us that all will come to pass whether it be blessings or trials. Far from despair, preparing for our own death helps us to meditate constantly on the Triune God who loves us, calls us to relationship, gifts us with our blessings, and sustains us in our trials.

I highly encourage you to watch the series, "Eternal Rest: The Art of Dying Well" on Formed.org. As Christians we have a very different attitude towards death. As we hear at so many funerals before the Eucharistic Prayer, for the Christian "life is changed and not ended." Keeping our death in mind helps us to live better, treasure each and every moment and person in our lives, and strive for eternal life. –Fr. Justin
