Brothers and Sisters,

This week, I received the official and unexpected word that I will be reassigned at the end of June of this year. I was surprised and saddened to learn that I would have to leave our community a year before I expected (which I already foresaw as something that would be difficult for me to do). I ask that during this time you please join me in prayer.

Scripture reveals to us many instances where God breaks unexpected news to His people and their reactions are mixed. Permit me just a couple of examples. God reveals to Moses that he will lead His people out of Egypt and Moses attempts to evade by reminding God of his weakness (Ex 3:11, 4:10, 4:13). On the other hand, Job receives increasingly bad news four times over (Job 1:13-19), and himself is afflicted with physical trials (Job 2:1-7), yet does not curse God (Job 1:20-22; 2:10). In the New Testament, Zechariah is told by Gabriel that Elizabeth is pregnant, yet he doubts and is rendered mute (Lk 1:20). On the other hand, the Blessed Mother reveals a receptive response to God's will when learning that she will conceive by the power of the Holy Spirit, even though there are many questions about the future (Lk 1:34-38).

A common thread that connects all these responses to unexpected news is trust. At first, Moses and Zechariah suffer from a lack of trust, and so are frozen in fear. Job and Mary had trust in our Lord and were set free to do His will even when it did not always make sense. During this time of transition for our community, let us keep our hearts set on doing the Lord's will, confident that, like always, He will see us through.

I believe that knowing the time of my departure will help us appreciate the months we have left together. But let us also use this time to pray for who will be coming to Holy Family to replace me and Fr. Edward. In addition, please pray for the communities that Fr. Edward and I will be sent to; communities that are still unknown to us.
