Three years ago, at the start of the Coronavirus pandemic, the Archdiocese of Milwaukee told each parish that the distribution of Holy Communion under both species (Body and Blood) should not take place and that distribution of the Body of Christ is the preferred method of distribution. Since then, the practice has been distributing Holy Communion under one species.

Now that the Archbishop of Milwaukee is discerning a return to the shared chalice, I felt that it was an appropriate time for us to discern this practice and pray about whether a return to the distribution of Holy Communion under both forms makes the most sense for our local community.

The current guidelines for Mass demand that pastors instruct the faithful about "the Catholic teaching on the form of Holy Communion as laid down by the Ecumenical Council of Trent."

In the 16th century, the Council of Trent taught the doctrine of concomitance: "Under only one of the two species the whole and entire Christ and the true sacrament is received." Whether one receives the Eucharist under the form of bread, wine, or both, one receives the fullness of Christ, Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. For centuries, this belief was reinforced by the practice of the faithful only receiving the consecrated host. This is a belief we continue to hold today.

The Church teaches definitively that in the Eucharist, Jesus Christ is truly and substantially present, Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity, shared with us through the elements of bread and wine. While both elements together offer a more amplified sign, receiving both is not necessary. Quite understandably, some may think that Communion under both signs is always more appropriate because at the Last Supper, Christ gave the Apostles Himself under the form of bread and wine, but it is important to remember that the Mass is not merely a re-enactment of the Last Supper, as is present in areas of the United States with heavily populated Protestant faith communities. Rather, initiated by Jesus at the Last Supper, the Mass is a liturgical action that has organically developed over a 2,000-year history whose theological content derives from our Lord's passion, death, and resurrection. Without His sacrifice, there would be no communion. The distinctiveness of receiving Holy Communion under one species alone provides the opportunity to remind the faithful that the Mass is a participation in the One Sacrifice of Calvary—a uniquely Catholic belief.

Distributing the Eucharist only under the species of bread also ensures that the Eucharist under the species of wine is never spilled. I have experienced such accidents at Masses more often than I would like to believe. The Church teaches that when "even a small danger exists" of such an accident happening, Communion under both forms "is to be completely excluded" (Redemptionis Sacramentum, no. 101). Holy Communion under one form entirely prevents such mishaps and safeguards the sacredness of the Eucharist.

In addition, the Church teaches that there are certain circumstances when "the chalice should not be ministered to lay members of Christ's faithful," including when "a notable part of the people continues to prefer not to approach the chalice for various reasons, so that the sign of unity would in some sense be negated" (Redemptionis Sacramentum, no. 102). When the receiving from the chalice is offered, a majority of our parishioners continue to choose not to receive our Lord from it.

Offering Holy Communion under the form of bread alone also decreases the spread of germs. As you have been recently reminded at every Mass by listening to the soundtrack of coughing and sneezing, the cold season is well under way. From talking with parishioners about the distribution of Holy Communion, many are concerned that receiving the Eucharist from the distribution chalice puts them at risk to contract viruses. And because the purifying of vessels is permitted only for priests, deacons, and instituted acolytes, the priest does not have the option of avoiding these germs.

Given these reasons for distributing Holy Communion under one species only, most countries around the globe only distribute the Body of Christ. The common practice in the United States of distributing both the Body and Blood of Christ is an anomaly.

Technically speaking, the Bishop of the diocese has the ability to allow distribution of Holy Communion under both kinds. If he gives permission, then Communion can be distributed under both forms in parishes if it seems "appropriate to the priest to whom, as its own shepherd, a community has been entrusted." (General Instruction of the Roman Missal, no. 283).

At this time, I have decided that Holy Family Catholic Community will not resume offering Holy Communion under both forms. At the discretion of the Worship Commission, Holy Communion may still be offered under both forms on certain Holy Days. After much prayer, consideration, and conversation, I believe distributing under one form on weekdays and most Sundays is a prudent decision. If you would like to speak with me directly about this, please know that I would welcome a conversation with you.

Rather than allow the absence of the distribution chalice to disappoint, my hope is that parishioners would see the catechetical opportunity and benefit from it, and that this will provide the opportunity for everyone to focus more intensely on the sacred reality of the true Presence of Jesus at every Mass, especially at the moment of receiving the Eucharist. To receive the Eucharist under the matter of bread is to receive the fullness of Jesus Christ, Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. Sometimes we become so established in our routines that this reality can easily escape us. I am also hopeful that less Communion stations will increase reverence toward the Eucharist (for example, always bowing or genuflecting anytime you are in front of or passing by the Eucharist). Increased reverence helps welcome the gift of deeper faith in the real Presence.

I want to acknowledge and thank the many Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion who have been very gracious in helping distribute the Body and Blood of our Lord so reverently and prayerfully.

I pray this modification of HOW we receive does not distract us from what is most important. Though the experience of receiving may be different, the One Whom we receive remains the same, yesterday, today, and forever. We should try not to be excessively focused on the visible sign of bread or wine, which merely serves to communicate the reality that it contains. In the end, whether we receive the Eucharist under one form or two forms is of minor importance. What is of major importance is Jesus Christ, who continues to offer himself to us, Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity, in the Most Holy Eucharist.
