Holy Family is hiring! We are currently seeking to fill two roles in our Christian Formation Ministry: a High School Faith Formation Coordinator and an Administrative Assistant. **The High School Faith Formation Coordinator** collaborates with the Priest Team and Director of Christian Formation to manifest the vision for the catechetical and sacramental life of the parish through the High School Formation Program and Confirmation Preparation Program, including weekend retreats. In addition to managing these programs in accordance with United States Conference of Catholic Bishops and Archdiocese of Milwaukee guidelines, the coordinator will organize Youth Group and oversee and assist catechists and other volunteers assisting in various Formation programs, prayer experiences, events, etc. This full-time coordinator also is in charge of establishing a program calendar, evaluating programs, communicating and working with parents, and maintaining records. A bachelor's degree in theology/education/social work/psychology from a Catholic institution of higher learning is preferred, and the coordinator is required to have at least two years of experience in a parish or Catholic school setting as a catechist, teacher, or administrator. The **Administrative Assistant** will work with those in Christian Formation to organize and support its programs and events. A Letter from Your Holy Family Priest | "Be sure to stay close to Holy Spirit"

Today we celebrate Pentecost Sunday in which we commemorate the sending of the Holy Spirit upon the Church. I remember attending a banquet following a friend's ordination to the priesthood where I was reminded of the personal reality of the Holy Spirit. My friend's sister is a Poor Clare nun and while she was not able to attend the ordination in person due to her vow of enclosure, she was nevertheless eminently present through the Holy Spirit. She wrote a letter that was read aloud and each word, you could tell, was saturated in prayer and vivified by the Holy Spirit. I would say that you could hear a pin drop during the reading of the letter, but instead the pauses between words were filled with snuffles heard across the room.

One thing that I cannot forget about that letter was how this man's sister referred to the Holy Spirit. I do not believe that even once she used the article *the*, which can have the effect of reducing the Third Person of the Blessed Trinity to a bland and generic spiritual force. Her letter would contain phrases like, *Holy Spirit tells me to say...* or *Be sure to stay close to Holy Spirit*. At first it sounded odd, for I was used to always hearing *the* Holy Spirit, but soon I realized she was speaking from a very different place, spiritually speaking, than most in the room. As the letter went on, I was convinced that she spoke with an intimacy with Holy Spirit, who was poured out into her heart at baptism, sealed within her at Confirmation, and was a constant companion in her prayer. It was clear that she knew Holy Spirit was not an impersonal force.

Holy Spirit is a gift given to the Church and each member thereof. As Catholic Christians we recognize the central mystery of our faith is the Blessed Trinity - Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. It has been revealed to us through Sacred Scripture and Tradition that the love poured out from the Father to the Son, and returned from the Son to the Father, occurs within the exchange of love of Holy Spirit. What is remarkable about this? Consider again the Gospel when Jesus says, receive the Holy Spirit. Friends, Scripture reveals today that we are loved the with same love that the Father and the Son share from all eternity. May we all grow in deep relationship with Holy Spirit and allow Him to empower us to bring others into this same embrace we experience.

Dear Friends,

Last year, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops began a multi-year Eucharist Revival designed to help each of us foster a deeper understanding and devotion to the great mystery of Christ's presence in the Eucharist.

After consultation with the Priest team, Pastoral Council, Worship Commission, and our Arts and Environment Committee, one of the ways that we hope to do this at Holy Family is by relocating the tabernacle at Holy Family Church from the side chapel into the sanctuary of our main church.

The tabernacle is the place where the Eucharist is stored safely between Masses. The movement of the tabernacle into the sanctuary of the Church will help all of us better understand the reality that our community is centered not on an abstract idea or vague purpose but is centered on the person of Jesus Christ.

Placing the tabernacle in the sanctuary, where we all gather to pray, is a visible reminder that we are the body of Christ with Jesus as our head. It is through the Eucharist that we find the source and summit of our Faith and it is in the Eucharist that we are brought together as one.

My hope is that moving the Eucharist to the center of our Church (thus matching all of our other five church sites) will grant a deeper dignity to the Eucharist during Mass.

Over the next few weeks, we will be working with Capelle & Diedrich Construction to build a platform within the sanctuary. The platform will match the design of the existing floor in the sanctuary and will provide a raised place for the tabernacle to reside. Construction of the platform will take place the first week of June with the dedication of the new Tabernacle location taking place at the 10:00 am Mass on Sunday, June 18th.

In the coming months, our Worship Commission will discern the best options for the current Eucharistic chapel, but initial conversations appear to be leading us towards creating some type of devotional space for parishioners to use.

Pilgrim Sculpture: "Memorial for Unborn Children"

On behalf of Holy Family's newly formed Respect Life Committee, as the Church honors June as the month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, so also will we celebrate, remember, and revere the heart of the gift which is all human life, from conception to natural death. In a particular way, as our country prepares to mark the first anniversary of the Supreme Court's decision in *Dobbs v. Jackson's Women Health Organization*, as a parish, we pray for and remember all children and families wounded by abortion, not only in the past, but also today. We are grateful to have received two copies of the sculpture, "Memorial for Unborn Children." Throughout the weeks of June, each of our churches as well as our Adoration Chapel, will host these tender works. They will serve as a reminder both of this painful reality and the possibility of reconciliation with God, and the need to pray for conversion, beginning with ourselves. Additional literature and prayer cards, especially those encouraging the practice of spiritual adoption, will be left by the sculptures. A second statue will be in the Sacred Heart Adoration Chapel the entire month.
