*A letter from your Holy Family priest | "It is the center of everything we do, believe, and who we are."*

Peace of Christ! My name is Fr. Kevin Tanel and I am one of Holy Family’s new associate pastors. I was just ordained a priest on May 20, and I am very excited to begin my first assignment here at Holy Family. I look forward to getting to know many of you and your families during my time here, and to serving the Lord and His Church together. I am humbled by and grateful for this opportunity. I am already so moved by this parish’s love for the priesthood.

Earlier this week, the Tabernacle at Holy Family was moved to the center of the sanctuary. The primary reason for this move is to foster greater devotion to Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. Additionally, the timing of this move is providential. In the Church, the month of July is dedicated to the Precious Blood of Jesus Christ. The Tabernacle, which holds the Precious Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus in the Eucharist, reminds us as Catholics that the Eucharist is at the center of everything. It is the center of everything we do, believe, and of who we are. As the Second Vatican Council states in its document on the Church, Lumen Gentium, “The Eucharistic sacrifice is the fount and apex of the Christian life” (LG 11). In the Eucharist, we not only receive grace, but the giver of grace Himself. As such, having the Tabernacle in a visible place at the center of our church reminds all of us who it is we receive and why we gather together at Mass.

With this move, there are some minor changes to our gestures at Mass. Now that the Tabernacle is visible to all upon walking into church, it is most appropriate to genuflect prior to entering and leaving one’s pew, as well as anytime we pass the middle of the church. If you are unable to genuflect, a bow is sufficient.

We give thanks to God for the gift of Jesus’ precious body and blood in the Eucharist. May our worship of God in the Eucharist always be the center of our lives.
