One of Jesus main teaching methods in the Gospels is through parables.

The Greek word for parable is parabole which shows that it is a loan word from Greek into English, and the Greek word literally means to throw two things together. Although the Greek word parabole is a translation of the Hebrew word mashal, which literally means a riddle or a proverb. So, the idea of Jesus teaching in parables here isn't just comparison stories, but they are also riddles.

Whenever you read the parables of Jesus you want to ask yourself "Is there something unusual going on in this comparison?" Or "Is there something unusual in the story?" In essence, we need to find the answer to the riddle. We need to "look for the twist." There is almost always a twist in Jesus' parables, something unexpected. If you can figure out the twist, then you are going to get at the heart of the parable and unlock it.

For example, in the Gospel, we heard about the farmer that has a mix of wheat and weeds in his garden. One twist is that the farmer does not practice normal gardening practices by pulling out the weeds. Second, if you have a garden, then you know that weeds grow just about everywhere, but he knows that this is the direct result of an enemy. So, when Jesus is talking about the Kingdom of God, he is describing it as a mixed bag. This garden would look messy, not like a glorious field of golden wheat like we would hope. Jesus' point here is that there is going to be good and evil in the kingdom until the very end. God in his providence allows the good and the evil to stand, to grow, and to speak next to each other. He is not unaware of the evil, and he is going to do something about it. Although just like the farmer, he is going to wait to sort it all out in the end.

St. Teresa of Avila said, "When we encounter difficulties and challenges within the Church or in the world, let us remember that God works in mysterious ways. Like the wheat, we are called to grow and bear fruit, despite the presence of weeds around us. Trust in God's providence, for He will bring forth the abundant harvest."

In parables look for the twist!
