A letter from your Holy Family Priest | To Jesus, through Mary

Last week, we celebrated the Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary, a holy day of obligation which honors the sanctity of our Lady, and indeed the love our Lord had for her in bestowing on her this great grace. From my perspective as a priest, there is always an extra air of excitement on these holy days, particularly ones that honor our Lady. The use of incense on a random Tuesday in August and a packed church in downtown Fond du Lac, as well as the beautiful Marian hymns that were sung, brought great joy to my heart and I know to many others as well.

And yet, despite the beauty of the day, it is nonetheless inconvenient. It is the middle of August, right before the beginning of the school year, at which time many of us have a million and one things to get ready. It is for precisely this reason that the Church not only asks but commands that we slow down and spend some time with our Mom. Our Mom, Mary, who knows exactly what to say when our hearts have been broken, who encourages us in moments of weakness and failure, and most importantly, who leads us to the heart of her son, Jesus. Frankly, each one of us can come with all kinds of reasons to avoid prayer, to avoid Mass and the Sacraments, yet the Church communicates to us this week that we cannot live without it. We cannot live without offering worship to God, we cannot live without the Eucharist, and we cannot live without the maternal care and protection of our Lady. The phrase "To Jesus, through Mary", made famous by many Saints throughout the centuries, is our anthem as Catholics. Moreover, the Church encourages us to take up that anthem as our own today and every day of
