A letter from your Holy Family Priest | "...Be transformed..."

Dear Friends,

Praised be Jesus Christ!

As the Lord gathers us to worship this Sunday, we hear from Saint Paul his powerful proclamation to the Romans, words which, in part, include this clarifying invitation:

"Do not conform yourselves to this age, but be transformed..." (Romans 12:1-2).

On the first day of morality class during sophomore year at Marquette High, our teacher, Mr. Dan Holahan, began the semester by challenging us to commit these verses to memory.

Without them, without lives patterned after Christ, without our spiritual worship and living sacrifice, not only would the Church's great moral tradition seem to be without any foundation, but also our life with Christ would seem to be a burden or imposition rather than an adventure.

The Lord calls us back this weekend to what is *good* and *pleasing* and *perfect*, crosses and all. *That* invitation alone endures and can enkindle once again our faith, families, hearts, and parish.

Before summer ends, allow me to name several graces and observations from these last months.

- 1. Thank you for your prayerful support of our young adult pilgrims during our pilgrimage to World Youth Day in Portugal earlier this August. While at the Shrine of Our Lady of Fatima, I had the gift to offer my Mass intention for Holy Family. There, I prayed for a more authentic conversion unto the Lord, beginning with my own, and including us all.
- 2. Recently, I have joined several of our parish families not only for joyful celebrations of wedding anniversaries, but also sorrowful funeral Masses. At each of them, I was struck by their trust in the Lord and the Grace of the Sacraments, as well as their profound love for the living tradition of their family. That's not unique to them, but rather is shared by so many in our parish. *Thank you* for inviting us as your parish priests into your families.
- 3. To that end, really ever since Easter, as priests we seemingly continue to have a similar conversation, together humbled by the way in which the Lord *is* at work, in our parish, in our community, in our lives and on the Ledge. With that grace has also come many more crosses, be they permitted, produced or promoted. To see not only conversion lived but also suffering received and endured has been a source of consolation and strength to me.
- 4. If you haven't yet seen the *Sound of Freedom*, I would strongly encourage you to watch this film, which so many have recommended to me. My thanks to Community Church for their recent screening and conversation. We beg the Lord for the freedom of those imprisoned, for the ones who rescue them, and for greater purity and chastity of us all.
- 5. *Finally*, although I serve as the Chaplain at St. Mary's Springs, and thus am very much a Ledgers' fan, as our parish community includes North Fond du Lac, congratulations are due to the Orioles, whose football team beat Ripon last Thursday, August 24, 20-14. Truly, an impressive victory by their team that brings both an end to a very long streak and the beginning of a new era in North Fond du Lac. "A rising tide lifts all ships!"

Serving Those Most in Need in our Community

Dear Holy Family Catholic Community Parishioner(s),

Throughout the Bible, one of the most prevalent of Lord's commands is that we care for the poor. As Jesus said in the Gospel of Matthew, "for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me."

In our ministry here at Holy Family, we seek to answer this call in whatever way we can. Whether it be through our Blessed Bites program, assisting those who are hungry, or our Holy Family Outreach Center, in which we offer shelter to the refugees. We felt the Lord's call to further expand this ministry to the homeless by opening the Holy Family Warming Shelter this November.

When we learned two months ago that Fond du Lac would not have a warming shelter to care for the homeless this winter, we began working to see how our parish could help address this issue. After many conversations within our parish and with organizations in our community, we decided to heed our Lord's call and pursue opening a new warming shelter. Since then, we have looked at multiple locations, and received approval from the Archdiocese of Milwaukee to put an offer on a location. We are now awaiting approval from the City of Fond du Lac to move forward.

The Holy Family Warming Shelter will operate on the Catholic values of compassion, dignity, and care for people of all backgrounds and beliefs. We will offer up to 30 individuals a warm, clean place to sleep; hot, nutritious meals; showers; and access to community resources every night from November through April this year, and once the space is renovated, all year round.

While our parish will run the shelter, it will thrive through the collaboration of the greater Fond du Lac community. The need to provide shelter for the city's homeless population has been an ongoing issue in Fond du Lac, one which many have worked to address. The Salvation Army of Fond du Lac County most recently led this effort, and we thank them for their important service to our community. The St. Katharine Drexel Shelter also serves those without a home throughout the year, but this shelter will serve as a low-barrier shelter for those in immediate need of a warm place to stay.

We are committed to working with government agencies, community organizations, and volunteers to provide the best care to those at the shelter, and to tackle the issue of homelessness from many angles. We have already seen great support from community organizations and businesses, as well as from the City of Fond du Lac, who has been a great help through this process.

With the Warming Shelter's planned central location, the clients will have access to public transportation, as well as many organizations located near downtown. It is our hope that through the shelter, those who are struggling will be able to move forward and take steps towards stability.

Numerous sources will fund the Holy Family Warming Shelter, including government grants, private donations, and corporate sponsorships. We are grateful for the support of the local churches and benefactors who have already generously contributed to this project.

We of course welcome your involvement in this new mission. If you are interested in making a monetary donation to the shelter, please make your donation to Holy Family Catholic Community with "Warming Shelter" in the memo line. We are also hiring for the shelter, and those interested in learning more can visit hffdl.org/warming-shelter. In addition, we are looking to fill many volunteer slots and/or have volunteers provide a nightly meal. Please watch for future announcements of how you can get involved.

It is a blessing to care for those in need in our community and it is through your generosity and the grace of God that this is possible. I thank you for your support of our parish, and I look forward to sharing with you the progress and good work taking place at the Holy Family Warming Shelter.
