A letter from your Holy Family Priest | A Priest Forever

Once the priest is ordained, the indelible character of the priestly order remains imprinted on his soul. That means a priest is a priest forever. It is an explicitly defined dogma of faith that the sacrament of Holy Orders is one of the seven sacraments of the New Covenant instituted by Our Lord Jesus Christ.

The Holy Orders is the sacrament by which some of the faithful are constituted sacred ministers. A priest has been marked with an indelible character. Thus, they are consecrated and destined to shepherd the people of God according to the degree of each one, performing in the person of Christ, the Head, the functions of teaching, sanctifying, and governing. Jesus Christ is the true and High Priest of the New Covenant, because only Jesus reconciled us with God the Father through his blood shed on the Cross (Hebrews 8:1; 9:15). However, Jesus wanted some men, chosen by him, to participate in the priestly dignity so that they would bring the fruits of redemption. This is the end which Jesus instituted the priesthood of the New Covenant (Luke 22:19). The Apostles, inspired by God, transmitted the ministry through the sacrament of Holy Orders, which they administered by the imposition of hands and prayer (Acts 14:23 -24). In this way they communicated to other men the power to govern, sanctify, and teach. They had received directly from Our Lord Jesu Christ.

Jesus Christ did a special choice (Mark 3:13–15); "You did not choose me, but I chose you" (John 15:16). So, Jesus choosing the Apostles, entrusted them with a mission and gave them particular powers: **a)** the power to be able to forgive sins (John 20:23; Matthew 16:19; 18:18); **b)** the power to administer all sacraments and to preach the Word of God (Matthew 28:19–20 and John 20:21); and **c)** the power to renew the sacrifice of the Cross at the Holy Mass, until the end (Luke 22:19; 1 Corinthians 11: 23–25). This is the main power that priests receive, since the priesthood is primarily ordered to offer the sacrifice. These powers come from Jesus Christ himself, which were given by the Lord to his Apostles for one purpose: to continue his redemptive mission until the end of the centuries (Matthew 28:20 and John 17:18).

The sacrament of Holy Orders is a sacred Order because it consists of ordered degrees, hierarchically subordinated to each other, from which the ecclesiastical hierarchy results. That is why by sacred ordination the priest is constituted a minister of God and dispenser of divine graces (1 Cor 4,1). By the ordination, the priest receives a series of supernatural effects that help him fulfill his mission: the indelible character of the priesthood which makes a priest forever (Hebrews 5,5 -6).

The priestly character does all this through a configuration of the one who is ordained with Christ, Head of the Mystical Body, which enables him to participate in a very special way in his priesthood and in his triple function. That is why the priest becomes: **a)** authorized minister of the Word of God; **b)** minister of the sacraments; and **c)** minister of the people of God. The sacrament of Holy Orders increases sanctifying grace. It also grants sacramental grace; that is, the supernatural help necessary to be able to exercise the functions corresponding to the degree received.
