Dear Holy Family Catholic Community Parishioner(s),

We are less than a month away from the opening of the Holy Family Warming Shelter and we are excited to share that we have made significant progress since our last update. Renovations at the Warming Shelter continue and are near completion in the sleeping quarters, bathroom, and kitchen areas. In just a few days, renovations will begin on the back portion of the building, which will serve as our entrance, and we will begin to install our security features and other technology.

Your support as well as that of our community has been integral throughout this process. You and your fellow parishioners alone have donated thousands of dollars to the shelter. Individual donations, including those from parishioners, now total over \$137,000. You've also made many donations from our Amazon Wish List, contributed nearly 1,500 pairs of socks to our Sock Drive, and provided us technology, like computers, for the shelter guests to utilize. The Fond du Lac community has also rallied in support, with businesses, organizations, and local churches contributing to shelter. Thus far, we have received more than \$208,000 in donations from community partners, including Ascension Lutheran, Celebration Assembly, the Congregation of Sisters of St. Agnes, Festival Foods, Fond du Lac Area Foundation, Fond du Lac Area United Way, J. F. Ahern, Loaves and Fishes, Open Circle Unitarian Universalist Fellowship, Pilgrim United Church of Christ, Mercury Marine, SSM Health, and Trinity Baptist Church, in addition to many anonymous donors. We are collaborating with several non-profits, including the Fond du Lac Family YMCA and Fond du Lac Public Library who have allowed us to use their space to register Warming Shelter guests at various times November 6-8. The YMCA is also providing showers to the guests during the shelter's season as we will not be able to offer showers until fall of 2024.

If you would like to help the Holy Family Warming Shelter, we are looking for volunteers as well as donations. We currently are seeking several items to help serve those at the shelter. <u>Please drop off all donations at the Holy Family Parish Office.</u> For more information, please visit hffdl.org/warming-shelter. Needed items include:

- Women's clothing: sweatshirts size L-XXL, sweatpants size M-XXL, winter jackets in all sizes, waterproof snow boots in all sizes, underwear in all sizes, long underwear in sizes L-XXL, and sports bras in all sizes.
- Men's clothing: waterproof boots in all sizes, sweatshirts sizes M, XXL, and XXXL, winter jackets in all sizes, long underwear in all sizes; and underwear in all sizes.
- Hygiene items: men's deodorant, lotion preferably in 3-6 oz. sizes, and individual Kleenex packs.

Homelessness is a multi-faceted issue with many causes. Low-paying jobs, lack of affordable housing, unemployment, poverty, and mental illness paired with a lack of needed resources can all lead a person to lose their home, and once someone does, it is difficult to regain stability on their own. It is through assistance and resources that people can begin to find their way to housing security. That is why we are so grateful that the Fond du Lac community has come together to care for those who are homeless. Thank you for all you are doing to help us in this effort.
