A Letter from your Holy Family Priest | "Behold the Lamb of God"
Throughout our lives, each of us has particular moments in which we experience God speaking to us. Perhaps you had a powerful moment in prayer or on a retreat, or maybe you saw God at work during a really challenging, even traumatic situation. Whatever it may be, no matter whether we were raised in the Church or if we were received into the Church later in life, we all have moments in which we experience in a way we cannot quite explain, the voice of God speaking to us. When we "hear" this voice, whether it be a literal hearing of the voice of God, an experience of peace and consolation, or a greater courage to carry our cross, it always results in a greater desire to follow Jesus. This, then, brings authentic joy - a joy infinitely greater than anything the world could offer.

In our Gospel today, we see the excitement of becoming a disciple of Jesus. Upon hearing from John the Baptist, the stunning proclamation: "Behold the Lamb of God," these two disciples cannot help but be intrigued, excited, and finally to take action and go and see Jesus for themselves. In meeting Jesus, the disciples are invited to give up everything and follow Him.

This interaction of Jesus with these two disciples are a model of how discipleship works. First, it is always the Lord who calls. It is never our initiative. The Lord placed a desire on the hearts of the disciples to go and meet Him, and gave them the courage to do so. Upon meeting Jesus, He asks them "What are you looking for?" - a question that cuts to the heart but is simultaneously filled with excitement and joy.

This point is vital for us to make progress in the spiritual life. At the end of the day, you and I are fundamentally receptive. Yes, Jesus invites us to respond and to respond generously, yet our Lord reminds us that it is He who constantly seeks us out. It is He that loves us to the point of going to the Cross, and furthermore, He who loves us that He willed to remain with us in the Holy Eucharist. It is He, Jesus, the Lamb of God, who loves you, who seeks you out, who invites you to follow Him. So the question, then, is this: "What are you looking for?" In answering this question, perhaps the Lord is placing within your heart a greater desire to know Him and to love Him. We do this most fundamentally by spending time with Him in prayer. Come to the adoration chapel for an hour this week and experience the joy and excitement these first disciples experienced upon seeing Jesus, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world.

It is a great joy to be your priest. Please know of my prayers for you and your families.
