## A Letter from your Holy Family Priest | How do we prepare to receive Holy Communion?

It is important to recognize that to receive Holy Communion is to receive Jesus Christ himself, the Son of the living God, who is present in the sacramental species. In the Most Holy Sacrament of the Eucharist is truly, really and substantially contained the Body and Blood together with the soul and divinity of our Lord Jesus Christ, and, consequently, the entire Christ. This presence is called "real," par excellence, because it is substantial, and through it Christ, God and man, becomes totally present in our soul when we receive Holy Communion.

For this reason, to receive Christ in Eucharistic Communion, it is necessary to be in a state of grace. If we are aware of having sinned mortally, that means, having offended God in a serious matter, we should not approach the Eucharist without asking for forgiveness and having previously received absolution in the sacrament of Penance.

It is important to remember among Catholics that there are three conditions to receive the Holy Eucharist: 1) be in the grace of God; 2) know who you are going to receive, approaching to receive Communion with devotion; 3) and keep an hour of fasting before taking Communion.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church establishes in number 1387 that to receive Communion worthily we must be prepared: "To properly prepare to receive this sacrament, the faithful must observe the fast prescribed by the Church (cf CIC can. 919). Through the physical attitude (gestures, dress) the respect, the solemnity, the joy of that moment in which Christ becomes our guest are manifested."

However, it must be clear that the Church does not intend to limit Communion but rather to ensure respect and veneration for such a great sacrament because we receive Christ himself.
