Holy Family to mark Safe Environment Awareness Week by wearing blue Monday

The Archdiocese of Milwaukee recognizes April 21-27 as Safe Environment Awareness Week. Each year in the month of April, which is recognized around the country as child abuse prevention month, we dedicate a week to elevating the general awareness of the Church's efforts to keep our children safe. We want people to know that we are committed to maintaining safe environments in our parishes and schools through adult child abuse prevention training; criminal background checks for all clergy, volunteers working with minors, and employees; safety training for children in each grade level; and adhering to all mandatory reporting requirement laws. This year join us at Holy Family to mark our support for child abuse prevention by wearing the color blue on Monday, April 22. Wearing blue helps remind us and encourage others to prevent child abuse and support healthy children and families.

A Letter from your Holy Family Priest: Marriage as a Sacramental Covenant

In the book of Genesis is found the basis of the covenant between man and woman and how God has created man and woman in a covenantal union to be complementary to each other because marriage was in God's plan from the beginning, and His plan of salvation of humankind, which is revealed in the new covenant of Jesus Christ.

In this context, Cardinal Outlet affirms that God's revelation regarding marriage has its core in two different accounts of creation: the priestly (Genesis 1:1-2: 4a, fifth century BC) and the Yahwist (Genesis 4:4b-25). He emphasizes the common element in both accounts as the unity of the couple (man and woman), which are found in two narratives: a) the formation of the woman by God from the man-body or flesh (Yahwist account -Gen 2:21-24). From this, Adam saw Eve (woman), his own complement, who was created in the same image and likeness as him. So, the spousal union is expressed with the affirmation: "they became one flesh (Genesis 2:24). Therefore, in Genesis 1:26, it expresses the nuptial bond between Adam and Eve. In this context, in Genesis 1:27, it is found the complementarity and identical dignity of a man and woman. Nevertheless, in Genesis 1:28, it is found God's blessing, which is a sign of His presence in them, and the gifts of a conjugal encounter between man and woman (Genesis 4:1). In this context, St. John Paul II refers to the book of Genesis as the origin of "Fundamental human community" (Genesis 2:24) and a procreative community of love (Genesis 1:28), which is an expression of the "Creator's salvific initiative." Thus, in the book of Genesis, God is the initiator of the covenantal complementary relationship between a man and a woman who He blessed from the beginning and is fulfilled by Jesus Christ in the new covenant.

Re: Liturgical Changes Effective May 1, 2024

Dear Holy Family Catholic Community Parishioner(s),

I am writing to share some important updates regarding our liturgical schedule, effective May 1, 2024. These changes are being implemented after much prayer and careful consideration by the Pastoral Council. Every effort was made to ensure that our parish continues to grow spiritually and serves the needs of our community effectively.

1. We will be introducing additional Mass times for the celebration of daily Mass in an effort to better serve our growing daily Mass population. This new Mass will take place at 7:00 am on Monday and Wednesday each week at Holy Family Church. This means that there will be a daily Mass prayed at Holy Family Monday through Friday at 7:00 am. Confessions will follow the 7:00 am Mass each day.
2. The Mass that normally takes place at St. Mary Church downtown on Monday and Wednesday will move to Sacred Heart Church. This Mass will take place every Monday and Friday instead of Monday and Wednesday, and be celebrated at noon instead of 12:10 pm. Confessions will take place before each Mass beginning at 11:15 am.
3. Because we are adding a noon Mass on Fridays at Sacred Heart, we will no longer celebrate the 9:00 am monthly First Friday Mass. Instead, we invite you to join us for the noon First Friday Mass.
4. The Wednesday 12:00 pm Mass that normally took place at St. Mary's will now take place at Marian University. This Mass will be celebrated all year. Confession will take place prior to the Mass from 11:15 to 11:45 am.
5. Thursday evening Mass normally held at Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary Church in North Fond du Lac will move to Sacred Heart Church. Instead of Thursday, this Mass will be celebrated on Wednesday evenings at Sacred Heart in an effort to better serve our youth and young adult groups that regularly gather at Sacred Heart on Wednesday nights. Confessions will begin at 5:00 pm with Mass at 6:00 pm.
6. A Holy Hour will be set aside in the Adoration Chapel at Sacred Heart for those who wish to come and make a holy hour and pray for families with us. This Holy Hour normally took place on Thursday evenings at Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary Church. Now it will take place from 7:00 to 8:00 pm in the Sacred Heart Adoration Chapel on Thursdays throughout the year.
7. A Mass will be celebrated all year long at Marian University at 5:00 pm every Sunday. This Mass will be open to the public and students as well. We will offer this Mass on a trial basis and decide after one year if the demand for an evening Sunday Mass all year long is warranted.
8. The Saturday morning Mass normally scheduled at 8:00 am at Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary Church in North Fond du Lac will move to Holy Family Church and be celebrated every week at Holy Family. Confessions will follow the Mass.

All of these adjustments to some of our existing Mass times are being done to better accommodate the preferences of our community members.

I understand that change can sometimes be challenging, but I firmly believe that these adjustments will ultimately strengthen our parish community and deepen our relationship with God. We will continue to introduce more opportunities to come together as a community in adoration and provide additional resources for spiritual growth and reflection.

I invite and encourage you to share any feedback or suggestions you may have regarding the new schedule or any other aspect of our parish life. Your input is invaluable as we strive to continue to grow our parish and create a vibrant and welcoming spiritual home for all.
