A Letter from your Holy Family Priest | "We as Christians need to learn to forgive"

Today's first reading comes from the Acts Of the Apostles after Saul "Paul" had a massive conversion. Our Lord spoke to him by asking, "Saul, Saul why are you persecuting me?" Saul realized that he needed to follow Jesus and become Christian.

Saul had killed a large number of Christians, and thus he carried a nasty reputation amongst the Christian Community. Now this man who may have killed your best friend, spouse, or other family member wants to join you as a Christian. I cannot imagine the strength that it took these Christians to be able to forgive Saul in spite of their woundedness by this man.

Whether it be from a loved one or an acquaintance, we each carry various wounds that prevent us from being able to forgive. But our Lord mentions multiple times in the Gospel like in the Our Father that we need to "forgive those that trespass against us." We as Christians need to learn to forgive, but too often our woundedness stands in the way.

Fortunately, we are launching the eight-part video series "Engaging your Story" on Wednesday nights at Sacred Heart Following the 6:00 pm Mass. Personally, I can testify that this series has helped me present a deep wound to Jesus to allow me to learn to forgive. Like the early Church in learning to forgive the future St. Paul, I hope that you would consider joining us in this journey of healing and forgiveness.
