Dear Friends, A Letter from your Holy Family Priest | Praying for the generations before us and those to come

On this great Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord, as we gather to worship and to pray the Mass, we also hear how Jesus sent his chosen friends into the world to proclaim the Gospel.

The vision of Jesus, crucified and risen, unlike our own, is limitless. For Jesus, the world into which he sent his friends was not merely the one known to them at that time, but also the places unknown that would hear the Gospel one day, including ourselves in Fond du Lac County.

For that reason, we pray for those today throughout the generations who have helped us to hear the Gospel, meet the Lord, and love our Catholic faith. So often those people include our own Mothers, for whom we give thanks and praise to God for on this Mother's Day Weekend

One such beloved person who followed the Lord's command was Fr. Joseph Salzmann, who died in 1874. Born and ordained in Austria, Fr. Salzmann was one of the first missionary priests to come to Milwaukee in 1847. Upon his arrival, Fr. Salzmann proclaimed the Gospel with haste. Soon after, alongside Archbishop John Martin Henni and Father Michael Heiss, Fr. Salzmann helped to found Saint Francis de Sales Seminary. Together, they laid the foundation of our faith.

Notably, Fr. Salzmann traveled by horseback throughout our region to minister to the new Catholic community and to rally their support for the building of the Seminary. In a powerful sermon delivered at the first chapel of St. Boniface in Germantown, Fr. Salzmann preached on the difference of desire that he found between the "old and new" worlds.

In Austria, Fr. Salzmann painfully noted that the people cry for bread, for they already have priests. But in America, the people already have bread. Instead, "they cry for priests."

Next Saturday, May 18, at the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist, nine new priests will be ordained to serve the Lord and to proclaim the Gospel here in Milwaukee. One of those priests, Fr. Kevin Durand, has been sent to Fond du Lac County and will begin at Holy Family in June.

Please join me in praying this week for these nine men who will be for us our priests, not only for today, but also, please God, for generations to come. May the Gospel be proclaimed anew!
