A Letter from your Holy Family Priest | The Sanctuary - a Holy Place

We usually can see many people in the Sanctuary before and after Mass. Sometimes, people approach the Sanctuary without reverence. Sometimes many people come to the Sanctuary dressed inappropriately. I would like to do a small reflection about the Sanctuary.

Etymologically, the word Sanctuary comes from Latin word Sanctuarium, "meaning 'holy place." If we do believe that the Sanctuary is a holy place, we should approach the Sanctuary with reverence because it is a place set apart for the sacrifice where the altar is located. Thus, at the altar is where the sacrifice is offered: "the Sacrifice of the Cross is made present" (GIRM

According to the General Instruction of the Roman Missal [GIRM 295], "The Sanctuary is the place where the altar stands, where the word of God is proclaimed, and where the priest, the deacon, and the other ministers exercise their offices." This means that only the priest and deacons, and the proper ministers could come to the Sanctuary and altar to exercise their own office. No one else is allowed to be in the Sanctuary because the Lord is jealous (Dt 6:15), and God is Holy (Isaiah 7:15). We should remember when Moses saw the burning bush and he went forward to look at it (Ex 3: 1-5) and the Lord said to him "Take off your shoes; the place where you are standing is holy ground (Ex 3:5)." Thus, the Sanctuary is holy ground where someone greater than Moses, Jesus Christ, is present (Hebrews 3:1-4). Therefore, the Sanctuary is a place of respect, dignity and reverence.
