A Letter from your Holy Family Priest | "The fount and apex of the whole Christian life"

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ.

A blessed Easter season to you! As we continue rejoicing in Christ's victory over sin and death, we are exhorted to "remain in His love." As Catholics, the most intimate, real, and extraordinary way we remain in Jesus' love is through receiving Him in Holy Communion. The Second Vatican Council reminds us that the Eucharist is "the fount and apex of the whole Christian life" (Lumen Gentium, 11), as this Sacrament not only gives us God's grace, but the giver of grace, God Himself.

I am so often edified by your love and devotion to the Holy Eucharist. Celebrating Mass and distributing Holy Communion is truly one of the greatest joys of being a priest. I see your love of our Lord in the way you pray at Mass, receive Holy Communion, and adore Him in the Adoration Chapel at Sacred Heart. Further, out of this love, many of you bring our Lord to loved ones, or to hospitals and nursing homes so that others may have that same joy as you and I. With this in mind, I wish to offer some reminders and suggestions for bringing Holy Communion to those who are not able to attend Mass that day.

Firstly, while this perhaps goes without saying, it is important that the Eucharist always be handled reverently. This has a couple of practical implications. For one, the Eucharist should always be placed in a metal pyx when being transferred. If you are in need of one, please contact our Parish Office. Secondly, once you have the Eucharist in the pyx, it is important to bring the Lord directly to the person you are ministering to. This means that other errands or activities must wait until after you have brought Holy Communion to those you are ministering to. Additionally, under no circumstances is the consecrated host to be left unattended. Thirdly, after the person you minister to has received Holy Communion, make sure the pyx is purified. This is done by placing a small amount of water in the pyx, consuming that water, and then drying it with a purificator. If you do not have a purificator, let the pyx air dry.

Finally, we are working on offering training sessions for those who wish to minister to the homebound. If this is a ministry you already engage in or are interested in doing, please watch for information and attend these sessions.

It is a great joy to be your priest! Please know of my prayers for you and your families.
