A Letter from your Holy Family Priest | Extra-ordinary Miracles

In 1263, Rev. Peter of Prague, a German priest, stopped in Bolsena, Italy while on a pilgrimage to Rome. He was celebrating the Mass in the Basilica, but when the moment of consecration arrived, he spoke the words of consecration and immediately blood started to seep from the consecrated Host and trickle over his hands and onto the altar. The veil of the appearance of bread and wine were ripped away for the Host was transformed into bleeding flesh. This miracle strengthened the wavering belief of the priest in the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist. The sacred bloodied host was inspected by Pope Urban IV and by St. Thomas Aquinas. This miracle helped convince the Pope to extend the feast of Corpus Christi to the universal Church so that everyone could recognize the love that God has for them through his greatest gift in the Eucharist.

These types of extra-ordinary Eucharistic miracles are not uncommon in the Church, and they have been reported all over the world from 750 AD in Lanciano, Italy to 2008 AD in Sokolka, Poland. In every Mass celebrated around the world, the host and wine are transubstantiated into the real body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ, but they still retain the accidents/appearances of the bread and wine. So, at every Mass even though it looks like bread, in reality we are receiving the king of the universe in the body and blood of Jesus, but there are moments when this veil is lifted and no longer do we see and feel the bread. In these moments, we can see the true reality of the Eucharist.

It is helpful to note that these extra-ordinary miracles have been tested scientifically and come up with a couple common points. First, the flesh is real striated muscular tissue of the myocardium (heart). In this way, we can understand that when one receives the Eucharist, one receives the heart of Jesus. Also, the heart/body is full of blood, so when one receives the host, they are receiving both the body and blood at the same time. Second, the blood type is always AB which is the universal receiver. So, no matter who we are, Jesus is the universal receiver that can take on our sins, and in him, we can all be one.
