# A letter from your Holy Family Priest | "Jesus alone gives life"

Jesus Christ always forces a decision. C.S. Lewis observed this in the 20th Century, saying, we cannot be indifferent to Him and simply praise Him for being a sage moral teacher. Rather, Jesus reveals Himself as "The One who came down from Heaven" (John 6:51) and tells us, "Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you" (John 6:53). These are not words which permit an indifferent response. Jesus Christ is either a liar, a lunatic, or the Lord. In any case, our response to Him must be decisive.

This is what we see at the end of the Bread of Life Discourse in our Gospel today. Many of Jesus' disciples say, "This saying is hard, who can accept it?" They reject him as a lunatic, demanding what could not possibly be done. How could they eat the flesh of the Son of Man? The apostles are likewise forced to decide. Our Lord asks, "Do you also want to leave?" Their response is perfect. They do not dwell on their emotion, but rather ask Him a question in response – a question we should all ask Him in our prayer when things become difficult – "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life" (John 6:68).

We do not call Jesus Lord because it is easy, or because the Gospel makes common sense to us. We do not want to have to die in order to take up our life again. Yet we see there is no other option, "Master, to whom shall we go?" Jesus Christ alone gives life. He alone is King. Let us clear the way to let Him reign supremely in our lives.
